

Home Support

The Tyendinaga Home Support program provides services that support and encourage independent living to seniors age 55+ and adults 18+ with physical disabilities living in the community.

Services include:

- Meals on Wheels;
- Home maintenance services;
- Friendly visiting;
- Transportation assistance;
- Social and recreational programs;
- Security and reassurance;
- Client intervention and assistance.

Emergency Response

This program provides information, referrals and assistance with medical alarms. The goal of this program is to provide clients with the security and confidence to continue to live independently.

To obtain a monitoring device, an installation and monthly monitoring fee is required. Clients may be eligible for financial aide and eligibility can be determined based on financial need.

Non-Insured Health Benefits

Health Canada provides registered First Nation and Inuit People with certain medically necessary health-related goods and services when they do not have coverage through private insurance plans or provincial/territorial health and social programs. These Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) include such things as:

- Prescription drugs;
- Vision care;
- Medical supplies and equipment;
- Short-term crisis counselling;
- Dental care;
- Medical transportation.

Medical Transportation Benefits are covered in accordance with the policies set out by NIHB and the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte; to assist eligible recipients in accessing medically required health services that are not available on the Territory or in the community of residence.

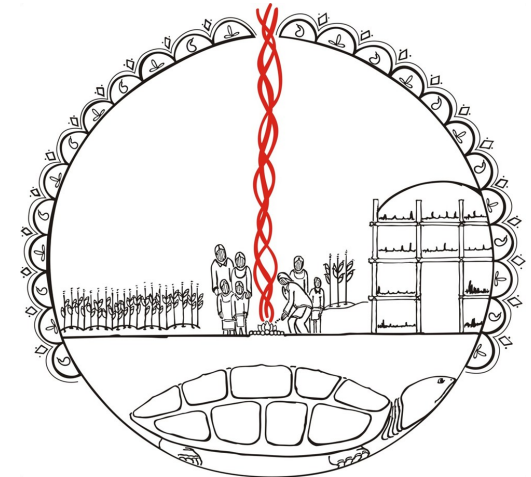

Tyendinaga Home & Community Care

A network of services provided by qualified staff to assist individuals in remaining in their own home for as long as possible.

- Services are based on needs identified through a client assessment;
- Services are provided in a confidential and respectful manner;
- Services deal with physical, social, spiritual and emotional needs;
- Support and assistance is available for family and caregivers;
- Services provided by Home and Community Care are supportive and are not meant to replace the care given by family and friends.

What are the services provided by Home & Community Care?

Client Assessments

- Talking with you and your family;
- Talking with your doctor and other people who have cared for you;
- Reviewing your health history.

The information gathered is used to plan your care and the services you need. Each plan is discussed in detail with the client.

Case Management

- Ongoing evaluation of clients needs and care plan development;
- Advocacy.

Personal Care

Assistance with personal hygiene and dress.

Home Care Nursing

- Nursing care provided in the home by Registered Nurses;
- Education for the client, family and caregiver on specified care;
- Treatments, dressings.

Home Making

Assistance with light housekeeping, laundry, meal planning and preparation.

In-Home Respite Care

Caring for a client when it is not safe for them to be left alone, allowing a break for family or caregiver.

Palliative Care

Assistance to family and caregiver when a client is not expected to recover.

Foot Care Clinic

Available to status residents of Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory who are unable to independently do their own foot care.

Community Support Worker

Available for friendly visiting for clients experiencing mental illness.

A variety of medical equipment is available for short term use through the Community Wellbeing Centre . Please call for details.



Home & Community Care services are available to:

Status residents of the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory of any age who have an assessed need and who:

- Have been discharged from hospital;
- Need nursing care in the home;
- Is unable to live alone while waiting for care in a long-term care facility;
- Has a disability requiring assistance to live on their own.

To family members and friends who need support to continue to care for the individual in the home.

Referrals

Referrals to the Home & Community Care program are not limited to hospitals, doctors and nurses.

You may refer yourself, a family member, a friend or a neighbor (with their permission).

All inquires and services will adhere to strict confidentiality guidelines.

MBQ Housing Program

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) provides a Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program (RRAP) that is designed to help renovate homes for those homeowners who have limited income, and who require those renovations for health and safety reasons.
