- Our Elders must be comfortable, well cared for, and surrounded by our support

#### 3. Sustainable Nationhood

- Resolution of the Culbertson Land Claim
- Sustainable Fiduciary Funding and recognition of the Nation to Nation relationship
- Increased non-Government non tax revenues
- Promotion of access and support of Post Secondary programs

If elected, I will request Chief and Council facilitate community wide strategic planning to respect and incorporate your ideas for sustainable development and community priorities. This consultation would consist of engaging our youth at Q.M.S. open sessions at the community centre, mail in surveys and social media.
