

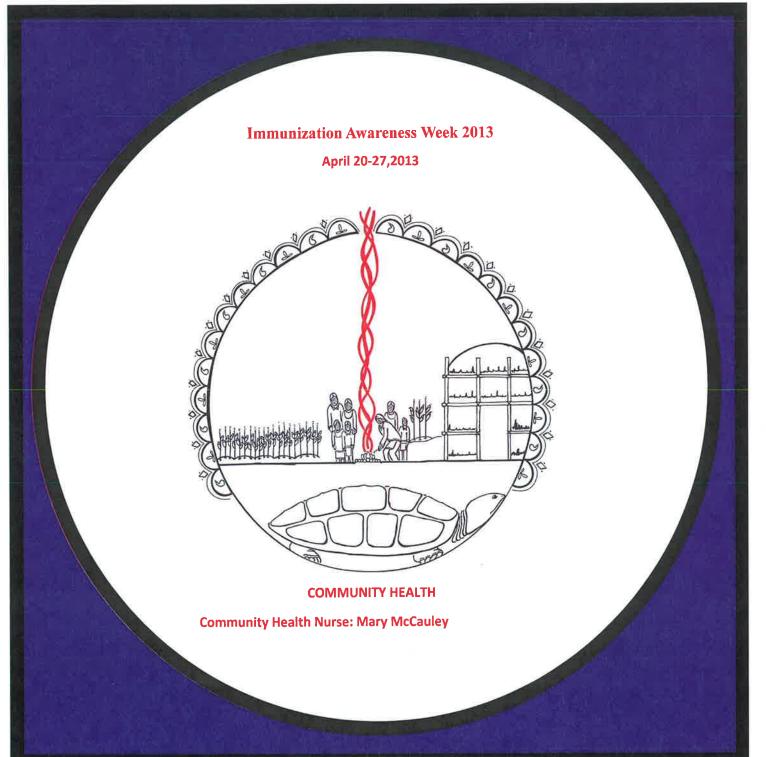

Dear Resident:

I am pleased to announce that primary health care services will now be offered on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory through a formal agreement with the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre.

The agreement between the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte and the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre gives individuals and families on the Territory without a family doctor, access to some primary health care through a Nurse Practitioner at our Community Wellbeing Centre as part of the health and social programs offered there.

The Community Wellbeing Centre is a central, easily accessible facility in which individual departments within the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte can work together to offer health and social programs. Lynn Brant is a dedicated nurse practitioner from the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre who will be on-site at the Centre on a regular basis. Primary care services that Lynn will be able to provide include physical assessments, diagnosis and treatment, consultation with physicians for ongoing illness and disease, and referrals if needed.

The partnership reflects the joint goals of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte and the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre to support the health and wellbeing of people who live in the community, and to help people become actively involved in their own care.

Striving to maintain a healthy community is the goal of our Community Wellbeing Centre. We offer a unique approach to holistic services that also promote the cultural needs of residents in the community. We look forward to the working relationship with the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre.

Why are primary health care services being provided through the Belleville and Ouinte West Community Health Centre?

The Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre is dedicated to improving access to appropriate health care services for people who encounter a diverse range of social, cultural or geographic barriers. With a dedicated nurse practitioner on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, community members can receive primary health care as part of other community health programs that recognize the specific needs of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte.

The nurse practitioner is supported by physicians at the Community Health Centre who can provide guidance and expertise when necessary.

What is a nurse practitioner?

Nurse practitioners are registered nurses with additional education and experience who are able to order and interpret diagnostic tests, communicate diagnoses, prescribe pharmaceuticals and perform specific procedures.

Nurse practitioners practice a holistic approach to health care, grounded in research. In addition to providing a wide range of health care services, they help clients access other health and social services that they may require. Nurse practitioners work collaboratively with many other health professionals. In particular, they consult with physicians, as required by the needs of their patients.

As a resident of the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, should I start to see the nurse practitioner instead of my family doctor?

No. The primary care services offered by nurse practitioner at the Community Wellness Centre will assist individuals and families who do not have a family health care provider, or if the family health care provider is not local.

If I am an MBQ member but do not live on the Territory, can I access the Nurse Practitioners services?

At this time the priority is to service clients who reside on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory.

Why do I have to register to see the nurse practitioner?

The Community Wellbeing Centre is not a walk-in clinic or an urgent care centre. By registering to make an appointment with the nurse practitioner, community members who do not have a family physician or have difficulty seeking help in conventional health clinics will become clients of the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre. This will facilitate management of medical records, prescription renewals, diagnostic tests and health-related care.

After I complete a registration form, how long will it take to get an appointment with the nurse practitioner?

Because of the demand for primary care services on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, it may take a few weeks after completing a registration form to get an appointment with the nurse practitioner, and this depends on urgency. Every effort will be made to schedule an appointment as quickly as possible based on the medical or health concern.

If I've already been using the current health and wellness services at the Community Wellbeing Centre, do I need to register for an appointment with the nurse practitioner or can I just telephone for an appointment?

Yes. You need to complete a registration form before you can make an appointment to see the nurse practitioner because although the primary care services on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory are being provided at the Community Wellbeing Centre, they are services through the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre.

Do I have to be a band member to see the nurse practitioner?

No. The primary health care services provided by the nurse practitioner on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory are for any residents in the community.

When will primary health care services start at the Community Wellbeing Centre?

It is expected the nurse practitioner will begin to schedule appointments effective April 2nd, 2013.

When will registration forms be available at the Community Wellbeing Centre?

Forms will be available in early April from the Health reception area of the CWC.

If I have a health issue that requires special treatment, will the nurse practitioner be able to refer me to a specialist?

Yes. The nurse practitioner will work with the physicians at the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre to assist with timely referrals for specialist care when necessary.

Although the Community Wellbeing Centre isn't a walk-in clinic, if I have an emergency, can I come to the Centre and see the nurse practitioner?

You <u>cannot</u> see the nurse practitioner without an appointment. There will generally be some openings for same-day visits, but you must call to arrange a same-day appointment. If the nurse practitioner determines there is a medical emergency, you will be referred to emergency care in a hospital.

If I'm a client with the nurse practitioner and there's a program at the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre that's not offered on the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, can I join that program?

Yes. Programs at the Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre are open to the MBQ community. The nurse practitioner can provide information on how to register for programs if you are interested in any.

Culbertson Tract Judicial Review Heard in Federal Court

On Monday, February 18, 2013, Alan Pratt, legal counsel for the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte and legal counsel for the government of Canada presented oral argument before Mr. Justice Rennie of the Federal Court of Canada in Ottawa. The judicial review application seeks a declaration that the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development has breached his duties to the MBQ by refusing to consider options that would result in the restoration of the Culbertson Tract to the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory without a surrender.

The Specific Claims Policy states that where land has never been lawfully surrendered, negotiations can result in the return of that land or compensation for its current unimproved value. The legal position of the MBQ is that the Minister has improperly refused to consider purchasing lands within the Tract in order to facilitate the return of land as contemplated in the policy itself. The submissions on behalf of the MBQ were that the position of the Minister is unreasonable, contrary to the honour of the Crown, contrary to the duty of the Crown to negotiate in good faith and contrary to the duty of the Crown to promote reconciliation.

At the conclusion of the hearing, Mr. Justice Rennie indicated that he would attempt to release his decision in the near future. Council believes that a positive ruling will enable MBQ to return to the negotiation table to seek the return of the land in a peaceful and orderly fashion.

Treaty 3 ½ also known as the Simcoe Deed 1st April 1793 220 years

In the years after the Landing on the shores of the Bay of Quinte on May 22, 1784, Captain John Deserontyon pressed the government for a deed to the land. It took almost 9 years. But on the 1st of April 1793, Captain John Deserontyon and Captain Isaac Hill attended a meeting at the Council Chamber, Navy Hall in the County of Lincoln. His Excellency John G. Simcoe, the Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada, The Honourable William Osgoode, Chief Justice for Upper Canada, and The Honourable Peter Russell, all members of the Executive Council for Upper Canada were present. At this meeting a report was read and approved. It described the lands to be "reserved for the Mohawk Indians at the Bay of Quinte":

"The tract will then be bounded in front by the bay of Quinte, between the mouths of the river Shannon, and Bowen's creek, about twelve miles - westerly by a line running north sixteen degrees west, from the west side of the mouth of the river Shannon, and easterly by a line running north sixteen west, from the mouth of Bowen's Creek, - and northerly by a line running east sixteen degrees north, and west sixteen degrees south at the distance of about thirteen miles back, from the bay of Quinte, measured on the western boundary [?] aforesaid to the north east angle of the township of Thurlow"

It was resolved at this meeting that this reserve for the Mohawk Indians settled on the bay of Quinte "be carried into execution and for that purpose that a grant be directed to be made under the great seal of the Province in favor of the principal Chiefs, on behalf of their nations (or tribe, as above mentioned), or persons in trust for them forever."

The grant that followed this resolution is known as the Simcoe Deed and also known as Treaty 3 ½.

The words of the Simcoe Deed are clear in the reasons for the granting of the land, it says:

"Know ye that Whereas the Attachment and Fidelity of the Chief Warriors and People of the Six Nations to Us and so Our Government have been made manifest on divers occasions by their spirited and zealous exertions and by the bravery of their conduct and We being desirous of shewing our approbation of the same, and in recompense of the losses they may have sustained of providing a convenient tract of land under our protection for a safe and comfortable retreat for them and their posterity."

The words of the Simcoe Deed say the land is given and granted "unto the Chiefs Warriors Women and people of the said Six Nations and their Heirs for ever". The land is granted to "them and their heirs for ever freely and clearly of and from all manner of Rents, fines or services whatsoever to be rendered by them the said Chiefs, Warriors Women and People of

the said Six Nations to us or our successors for the same and of and from all conditions, stipulations and agreements whatever except as hereinafter by Us expressed and declared;"

The Simcoe Deed goes on to say that that land is given and granted "and by these presents confirming to the said Chiefs, Warriors, Women and People of the said Six Nations and their Heirs the full and entire possession, Use, benefit and advantage of the said District or Territory of Land to be held and enjoyed by them in the most free and ample manner and according to the several customs and Usages by them the said Chiefs, Warriors, Women and People of the said Six Nations. Provided always and be it understood to be the true intent and meaning of these Presents that for the purpose of assuring the said Lands as aforesaid to the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the Six Nations and their Heirs and of securing to them the free and undisturbed possession and enjoyment of the same."

The lands were to be protected from trespassers, illegal alienations, and leases, but the Simcoe Deed provided a method whereby the land could be surrendered to the Crown under certain circumstances.

The document was made Letters Patent and the Great Seal of the Province was affixed.

Despite the noble words there have been trespassers, illegal alienations and leases. There have been surrenders. But the land of Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory is still held by the Chiefs, Warriors, Women and People of the Six Nations.

The Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte are still here – A community older than Canada, older than Upper Canada. And the grant for the land, Treaty 3 ½ or the Simcoe Deed, is 220 years old this year.

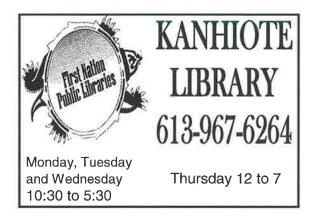

The program developed and provided by Wartenberg Business Consulting was made available at no cost to participants, thanks to the collaboration of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte Economic Development Department, and Kagita Mikam Aboriginal Employment and Training Services.

During the program, participants equipped with their business ideas, learned about business branding, the SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) as it pertains to the development and success of their business, bookkeeping/accounting, marketing, and WordPress for website development. Throughout, the one on one consulting as well as access to professionals afforded individuals with the opportunity to gear their learning to their specific business ideas. These workshops were designed to provide participants with a comprehensive business plan on completion of the program.

Birgit Wartenberg, Owner of Wartenberg Business Consulting stated that, "This concept was designed to encourage participants to start their own business, give them all the tools to do it, and most importantly, coaching every participant in their specific business during the one-on-one sessions." Late Pregnancy



The seventh, eighth, and ninth months of pregnancy are called the third trimester. The growing baby will outgrow the womb during this time, but early in the seventh month there is still enough space for him/her to straighten up, kick, bounce around, glide from one side of mom's belly to the other, kick, and even somersault. When your baby feels the thick, springy uterus against his/her foot, s/he may press the foot harder, then lift it, press again and lift... baby's first steps! These stepping movements help the baby to turn upside down, ready to be born, and help the baby to take an active role in pressing their way out of the uterus when it's time to be born.

We have learned a lot more recently about how much babies know and can do by the time they are born...much of this they learn in the three months before birth. The baby's senses become very well developed. The eyes are open, eyelids fringed with lashes, and s/he often moves eyes as if searching for something. As mom's uterus stretches, it becomes thinner, letting in more light and sound from the outside world. The baby's womb world is lit up by a red or orange glow when mom is in bright light, making it possible for the baby to even see shadowy silhouettes of his/her surroundings. Hearing is excellent, and so babies' responses to sound have been well studied. The baby is continually surrounded by sound: mom's constant, steady heartbeat; the rumblings of mom's stomach and intestines; blood pulsing and throbbing through the umbilical cord and large blood vessels...like the constant sounds of the ocean. Voices travel well across the mother's thinning abdominal wall and through the amniotic fluid...especially the lower male voice, giving dad a chance to bond with his baby before birth. However, the baby learns to know mother's voice best because s/he hears it more often than any other and also because women's voice range is the most clearly recognized against all the other background sounds. For this reason, newborn babies show a preference for their own mother's voice and language, either moving more or being calmed when mom speaks. Through mother's voice they learn to recognize language, tribe and kin.

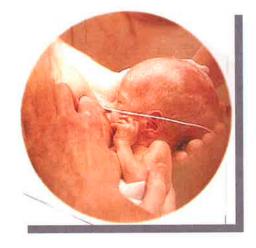
Familiarity with family and culture is also learned through flavours in the mother's diet, such as garlic, curry, berries, and herbs. Babies drink amniotic fluid in large quantities in the last trimester. Flavours that pass into both the amniotic fluid and into colostrum and breastmilk, help the baby to learn about their cultural diet and baby will be developing favourites already! There are recent studies being done that show that a mother's diet high in refined foods and sugar during pregnancy can have a lasting effect on a baby's health and preferences after birth, predisposing the baby to obesity, diabetes, and tooth decay

right from prenatal life. This is the time to make healthy food choices and diet changes if you haven't already!

Colostrum (the mother's first milk) tastes similar to amniotic fluid, so when baby nurses at the breast in the first few days after birth, or is fed expressed colostrum, s/he is comforted by this familiar reminder of the "womb home". Colostrum is also referred to by health care providers as "liquid gold", because it is so jam-packed with nutrients and antibodies that fight infection. It is literally your child's first immunization. Of all preventative interventions aimed at increasing survival of children up to age 5 (including Vaccines, Vitamin A, Sanitation, Mosquito Nets, etc), Breastfeeding has been found to be the most protective, saving the highest percentage of children worldwide (reported in Lancet 2003).

We are learning that babies born during the third trimester are able to breastfeed much

earlier than previously thought, given the right conditions and support (ie continuous skin-to-skin contact with mom, and avoidance of bottles). However, very premature babies or unwell babies may need some expressed colostrum/breastmilk even before breastfeeding starts. At London Health Sciences Centre (Ontario) there is a new way of giving very early babies the best chance of getting stronger called Oral Immune Therapy (OIT). Because colostrum destroys disease causing bacteria and viruses, colostrum is used as medicine even before the baby can be fed. Colostrum is collected by the mother hand expressing drop by drop



into tiny syringes (ie insulin syringes!) The syringe is then labelled and transferred either by nurse or by the mom herself to her baby, and is administered between the baby's cheek and gum and absorbed into the baby's tissues and immune system from there. Oral Immune Therapy is given to the baby every 3-4 hours round the clock until the baby is able to take feedings by mouth. Meanwhile mothers are encouraged to begin pumping to bring



in a ready milk supply for breastfeeding. This therapy has already been shown to decrease the risk of necrotizing enterocolitis (an often fatal gangarene of the gut) and pneumonia (especially when on ventilators). Babies who experience viral infections during the first year are also more likely to develop Type 1 diabetes. Breastfeeding helps to protect against infection, and so strikes another blow at diabetes!
