Trustee Report for March 2014

I will highlight some of the topics that Hasting Prince Edward District School Board is currently dealing with. These include: Trustee Elections, which are held in conjunction with Municipal Elections on October 27, 2014. Nine Trustees will be elected and one will be appointed under subsection 188(5) of the Education Act to represent the interests of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte; preparation for the final year (year 5) of the rollout by the province for all Boards of Education to offer full time junior kindergarten; Board approval for the 2014 – 2015 School Year Calendar. There was a special presentation made at the Board Meeting on March 24th which included an update of how First Nations, Métis, Inuit – collaborative enquiry at Harry J. Clark Public School was integrating Aboriginal culture and perspectives into their subject areas with tremendous interest and success. Troy Maracle, Aboriginal Coordinator, pointed out that this is happening in other elementary schools of the board as well.


Tuition Agreement meetings continue to take place with AANDC, HPEDSB and MBQ involved. Further information will be reported as it becomes available.

All applications must be received by <u>May 1, 2014</u> in order for organizers to secure adequate exhibition space. Applications to include a non-refundable deposit of \$25, with remaining fees to be paid upon delivery of artwork on October 2, 2014.

ELGIBILITY

All Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory artists of Aboriginal heritage, 18 years and older, are invited to participate.

ARTISTS ON SITE

We require all artists to be on-site

- during the Friday evening reception, AND
- Saturday 10 am to 1 pm OR 1 pm to 4 pm AND
 - Sunday 10 am to 1 pm OR 1 pm to 4 pm

STANDARDS

- 1. All work displayed must be the artist's original design and handcrafted by the exhibitor.
- 2. All submissions must be framed or mounted and ready to hang.
- 3. Artwork needs to have a wire as its primary mode of hanging, on the back (no saw tooth or other contraptions that take special nails and extra hammers). Ensure that the wire is in the upper quarter section of the frame for the best vertical hanging position.







Early Signs

Early Signs of Autism (12 to 24 Months) - child may demonstrate only a few of these symptoms

- Often begins to develop language then loses it, or doesn't acquire language at all
- May appear deaf, respond unevenly or not at all to sounds
- Difficulty consoling during transitions (tantrums)
- Difficulty sleeping / wakes at night
- Does not "point and look"
- · Failure to bond (e.g. child is indifferent to parents' presence)
- Self restricted/selected diet
- Limited imaginative play
- Not interested in playing with other children
- · Chronic gastrointestinal problems
- Repeated infections

Unfortunately many pediatricians and other physicians are not experienced in diagnosing Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Many physicians fear making the diagnosis because they were trained to believe that ASD is incurable. Don't accept your doctor's advice if he/she proposes a "wait and see" approach or promises that your child will "catch up". If your child has normal development and then regresses you should seek help immediately. A developing child's brain is pliable and there is a window of opportunity for recovery at a young age that diminishes as the child gets older.
