

FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 1992-93



All Children born in 1987 and residing on the Tyendinaga Territory are eligible for enrolment in senior kindergarten commencing September 8th 1992 at Quinte Mohawk School. (A junior kindergarten for four year olds is not presently available)

Kindergarten registration will take place on Friday May 15th 1992 8:30-4:00 p.m. and on Monday June 8th, 1992 8:30-4:00 p.m. at Quinte Mohawk School.

In order to register, every child needs proof of birth (birth certificate, baptismal certificate or status card) and a current record of immunization. Please contact Q.M.S. secretary Mrs. Angie Hill to book an appointment time.

If you know of a family who may be returning to the Tyendinaga Territory before September 1992 and who have elementary school age children, we would appreciate that information for next year's class and program preparations.

MOHAWKS OF THE BAY OF QUINTE BUS LINES

Dear Parents/Guardians:

As you may be aware, there are a great number of students riding buses daily, and their safety is our primary concern. Unacceptable behaviour is detrimental to the driver's ability to concentrate on driving and could lead to a safety problem on the bus. We cannot allow disruptive behaviour to continue if we are to be sensitive to the safety of pupils on the bus.

The problems that are identified can create unsafe situations for the driver and students on any particular bus. We are sure that you will share our concern and discuss unacceptable behaviour with your child and assist us in making the bus ride a safe one.

The following steps are being instituted immediately in order to assist with the discipline on the school buses. Also, a copy of a student behaviour report will be sent home with each child for your information.

MOHAWKS OF THE BAY OF QUINTE MUD CREEK (BIG MARSH) PROJECT

SUMMARY:

The Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte are undertaking a study of the Mud Creek Marsh (Big Marsh) to determine the environmental conditions of the water, soils, vegetations and wildlife.

A Study Team is being assembled to begin the study in the spring and work will continue through the summer. The Study Team will be comprised of three team members who will carry out the field work and obtain information essential for this project.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

The Study Team consisting of a Team Supervisor and two Study Technicians will report to the Office Manager/Assistant Office Manager with overall authority of the Tyendinaga Mohawk Council.

TEAM SUPERVISOR (1)

Duties and Responsibilities:

- (a) Responsible for ensuring that the required information for the study is collected and presented within the allowable time frame or deadlines by:
 - (1) Collecting and maintaining all survey/field study notes and necessary data;
 - (2) Ensuring that survey and field work proceed according to the alloted time frame as set in the Study schedule.
- (b) The Team Supervisor will provide direct supervision and establish clear lines of communication between all Study Team participants by:
 - (1) Maintaining daily attendance and time sheets;
 - (2) Assisting the Study Technicians in survey and field data gathering;
 - (3) Communicating regularly and frequently with other study participants;

(b) (4) Providing daily supervision and guidance to the Study Technicians.

Qualifications:

- A mature personality along with the ability to work well with others;
- Ability to work effectively with a minimum of supervision;



The Dry Grass season is upon us. Although it is wet below the grass, fire can still burn along the top. Grass fires are not to be taken lightly. Grass & Brush fire can cause serious damage.

FACTS TO PONDER:

- * 90% of All Grass Fires are caused by human carelessness or Arson.
- * Once out of Control they become wild fires.
- * Wind can cause fire to spread fast unevenly and to burn more intensely.
- * Larger fires can create their own wind.
- * Wind will quickly dry out damp fuel.
- * All ground cover vegetation is potential fuel.
- * Fire burns faster uphill than down.
- * Wind can carry sparks to start spot fires several hundred feet away.
- * Please refrain from throwing cigarette butts out vehicle window. They tend to stay lit and are easily blown into grass along the road.

For your protection and the neighbourhood's PLEASE CONSIDER ALTERNATE METHODS OF DESTROYING OF LONG GRASS & WEEDS; SUCH AS

- BUSH HOGS - RAKING & CUTTING

I am concerned about O.F.A.H.'s flagrant use and abuse of the media to misinform the public.

To cause public alarm, the O.F.A.H. is resident.

To cause public alarm, the O.F.A.H. is criticizing Native people for taking "pregnant" female pickerel, full of roe. The organization also claims that the month long spearing season will drastically reduce the pickerel population. There needs to be some clarification on these two points.

First, female pickerel are "pregnant" - full of roe - throughout the ice-fishing season. These fish are caught and have no opportunity, whatsoever, to go up the river to spawn. Nor are there any attempts to save those thousands of eggs. By taking fish in the spring, they have had a chance to spawn. The roe can be arificially fertilized and returned to the river, which has a very high success rate.

Secondly, let's look at the number of fish involved. Anglers caught over 200,000 fish in 1991. The people of Tyendinaga Territory caught 5,000 fish in the 1991 spearing season, less than 3% of the total harvest. On May 5,1991, opening day of pickerel season, over 7,000 anglers were on the Bay of Quinte, potentially 28,000 fish were caught in one day-5 times that of the entire spearing season. The Bay of Quinte pickerel season opens 1 week before any other in Ontario, causing a harvest which has a "detremental--even disasterous-- effect on fish stocks."

Perhaps, the energy of the O.F.A.H. would be better spent managing the angling fish harvest, rather than promoting violence and hatred toward Native people who maintain a traditional practice.
