



# ASSEMBLY OF FIRST NATIONS TAXATION BULLETIN

## 'AX EXEMPTION EXTENDED

Following a meeting with Minister Anderson on December 6, 1993, the Assembly of First Nations was assured that the Remission Order introduced for the 1995 year will be extended for another year. The Minister reaffirmed the statement of current Prime Minister, Jean Chretien, in his widely distributed letter of June 30, 1993. There he stated that "[the Liberal Party] believe[s] that Reverue Canada has introduced (the changes to the section 87 exerciption) based on a serious y flawed understanding of the Wittens case".

The Remission Order was put in place early fils year to ensure that the tax exempt on to the income of Indians would not change as Reverue Canada had announced last December. The extension of this order means that persons working for reserve-based organizations or companies will continue to be full tax exempt during the 1994 taxation year.

## COMMITMENT TO CONSULTATION

Minister Anderson also confirmed the commitment set cu: in the Liberal Party's Rad Book that policy changes will lake place only after prior consultation. The Assemby of First Nation's delegates clearly stated cissatisfaction with the process undertaken by Revenue Canada. Since July 1993, Revenue Canada.

officials have held meetings with First Nations representatives in various provinces. These meetings were airred at assisting Revenue Canada in defining a range of situations which would have sufficient "connecting factors" to fall within the runderstanding of the test in Williams.

## NO REAL CONSULTATIONS TO DATE

"There have been no meaningful consultations to date," Ontario Vice Chief Gordon Peters told Minister Anderson, The Chiefs made it clear that they reject the concept of guidelines, and do no: accept a discussion based on "connecting factors". If we are to proceed with a process it must start with Novegejock, not Williams.

## AFN OPPOSED TO CHANGES

The Assembly of First Nations has opposed the charges since they were first announced by Revenue Canada on December 29, 1992. At that time, Reverue Canada stated that "the income of an Indan working off reserve for an organization headquartered on reserve will no longer be tax exerts for that reason orly".

This change could have negatively impacted on many. First Nation businesses and political organizations who ere headquartered on reserve, but whose employees work off-reserve.

Prior to this announcement, the test used by

Revenue Canada n exempting emplayment inceme from laxation had been that articulated in the 1583 Supreme Court decision in Nowageyok. There, the Supreme Court of Canada looked to where the source of the income was situated in legal terms - the situs of the deblor.

## AFN COMMITTEE TO CONTINUE WORK

The AFN Corrmittee on Taxing Powers & Fiscal Mechanisms will continue to work at resoving baxalion issues concerning First Nations.

#### AFN ADVOCACY PROFILE

THE HONOURABLE RONALD A. IRWIN, MINISTER OF INDIAN AND NORTHERN AFFAIRS

On November 4th, 1993 Mr. Ron Irwin was appointed Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development.

Upon his appointment, the Minister is quoted as saying: "I'm sure there are hundreds of people in Canada who are more qualified than me - including Ethel Blondin" (The Ottawa Citizen, November 11, 1993).

He is also quoted as saying, "I'm going to make mistakes, but I will need to rely on the Chiefs to help me to do the best I can."

#### POLITICAL BACKGROUND:

Mr. Irwin was first elected to the House of Commons in 1980. Mr. Irwin was Parliamentary Secretary to then Justice Minister Jean Chretien, while serving as an MP between 1980 and 1984. He also served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of State for Social Development and to the Secretary of State for External Affairs. While Parliamentary Secretary, he served on the parliamentary committee on the Constitution.

He was a member of the Liberal Party of Canada's "National Campaign Committee", and has served as National Campaign Caucus Chairman and Northern Ontario Campaign Chairman for Jean Chretien. It is firmly believed that the Minister has a very close personal \_\_\_\_\_ brought in his own political staff or senior

relationship with the Prime Minister as a friend and confidante. His loyalty to Mr. Chretien during the Liberal leadership review would indicate this.

During his time in Parliament, he distinguished himself for his groundbreaking work as the Chair of the All-Party Sub-Committee on Acid Rain, which released two influential reports (Still Water - The Chilling Reality of Acid Rain and Time Lost - A Demand for Action on Acid Rain).

As former Mayor of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario from 1972 to 1974, he was a strong advocate of issues important to Northern Ontario. Mr. Irwin was elected to the directorship of the Ontario Municipal Association and to the Canadian Federation of Municipalities.

Mr. Irwin was elected by a 2 to 1 margin over the NDP incumbent. He represents the riding of Sault Ste. Marie.

#### FIRST NATIONS CONCERNS:

Mr. Irwin is a lawyer by profession and through his former firm (Caputo, Sarlo and Irwin) has been actively involved in representing and litigating land and Bill C-31 issues for Garden River First Nation and the Ontario Metis and Aboriginal Association in Northern Ontario.

He has indicated that he has not as yet

departmental managers. He would like to change the department into an advocate of First Nation's interests based on political input from First Nations.

Despite being quoted in the Ottawa Citizen as making it clear that he would not be the Minister to dismantle the Department of Indian Affairs, Mr. Irwin remains open to including this issue in the proposed bilateral process.

He views his role as being an advocate for First Nations to articulate their interests at the Cabinet table. He gives the impression that he prefers a "hands on" approach to dealing with issues. He has stated to some Chiefs that "... the former approach of appointing a special representative for the Minister has not worked. I believe you should deal directly with the Minister to address the issue and identify solutions and give direction to resolve the situation." For example, on November 18, 1993 The Ottawa Citizen reported that the former Minister's special representative on the Kahnesetake / Oka negotiations was released by the Department of Indian Affairs.

#### MEETING WITH NATIONAL CHIEF

On November 10th Mr. Irwin met with the National Chief. During these discussions, a basis for a promising personal working relationship was established. The Minister assured the National Chief of his commitment to the Liberal "Red Book" promises. He is open to further discussion on many issues including: treaty implementation, post-secondary education and a share in the Liberal Infrastructure program.

It was agreed that the way to achieve these goals is to draft a political accord between First Nations and the Federal Government to recognize the inherent right to self-government and treaty rights. The accord would initiate a bilateral

process of implementing the commitments made to Aboriginal people.

#### OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS:

Mr. Irwin has been a lecturer in government and business relations at Lake Superior State University from 1986 - 1991.

His service to the community includes: Trustship on the Sault Ste. Marie Board of Education, an Alderman, a member of the Community Services Board, the Historical Sites Board and the Public Utilities Commission, Director of the Sault Ste. Marie Museum and the Chamber of Commerce, President of the Sault Ste. Marie Law Association, and a member of the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission from 1977 to 1980.

In 1975, Minister Irwin was awarded the Order of Canada. He has also received the Sault Jaycee Outstanding Canadian and the Sault Ste. Marie Conservation Man of the Year Awards. He is also the recipient of the Queen's Jubilee medal and also the Commemorative medal in 1992.

#### PERSONAL INFORMATION:

The Minister presents himself as very personable with a "folksy" style which is similar to Mr. Chretien's "little guy from Shawinigan" approach. Mr. Irwin is married to Margaret Frech and they have three children.

BORDER CROSSING RIGHTS - US CONGRESSIONAL LEGISLATION 

In January of 1994 the US Congress is expected to hold hearings on a bill to "...restore and reaffirm the aboriginal rights of native Americans to free passage across the Canada-United States-Mexico borders." The attached draft bill contains specific references to the Jay Treaty, all lands listed in the yearly schedule of Indian bands, Reserves and Settlements published by the Canadian Ministry of Indian Affairs, and to members of a First Nation "recognized by the Canadian Ministry of Indian Affairs". When considered by the Congress this bill will have a direct impact on First Nations in Canada.


When the bill is introduced in the House of Representatives Sub Committee on Natural resources, several aboriginal organizations are expected to be invited to present testimony. The Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians (AIAI) has been asked to distribute the attached "discussion draft" in Canada and will work with the AFN national office to keep First Nations informed on its' status and hearing dates.

The AIAI, through the efforts of the Anti - GST Coordinator would like you to review the bill and present comments on how the bill can be approached to best reflect the interests of the First Nations. This information will be compiled and serve as a basis for presentations by witnesses to the congressional subcommittee. #### \$20,000 CHALMERS AWARD HONOURS CANADIAN CRAFTSPERSON
