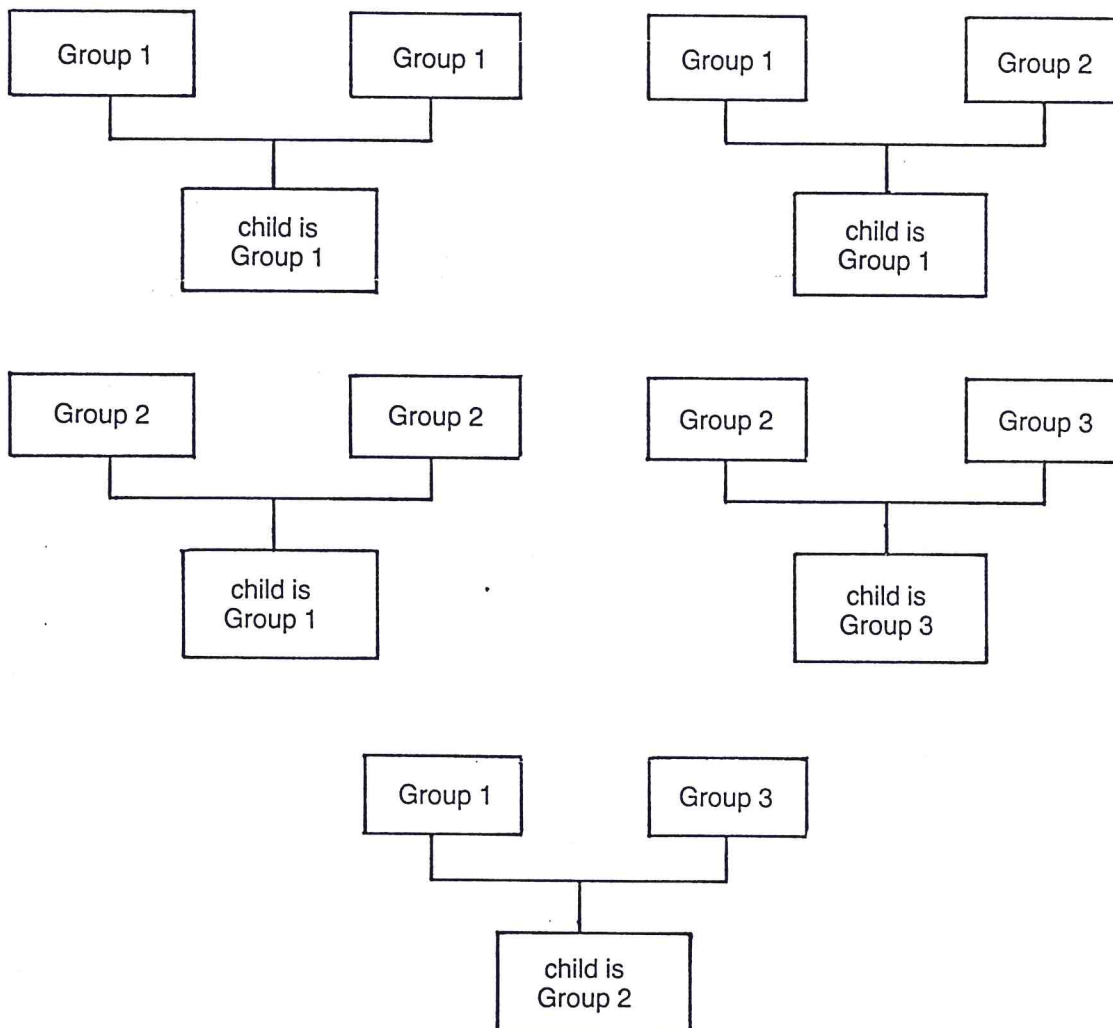
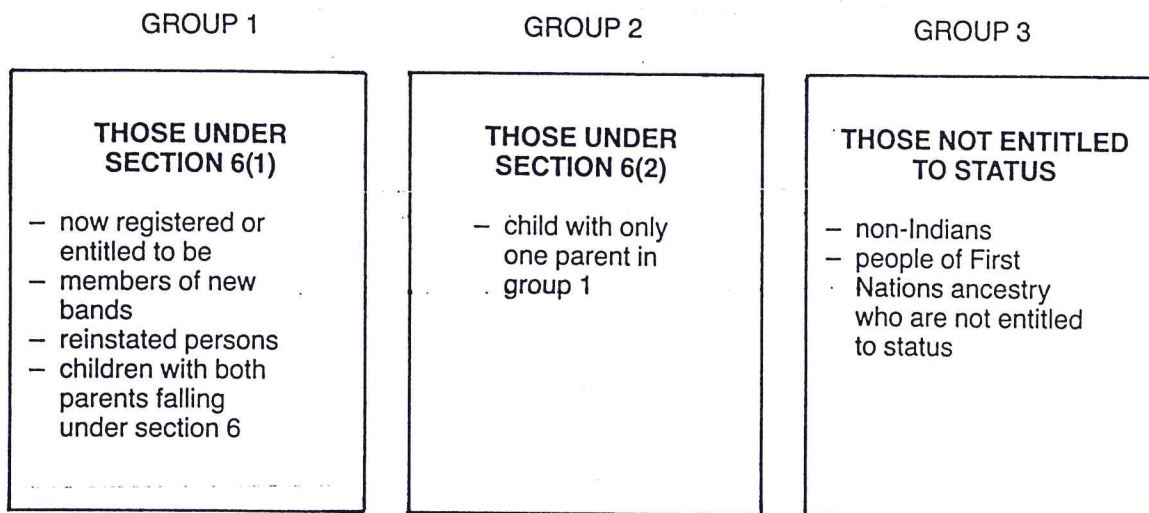

THE ROYAL COMMISSION ON ABORIGINAL PEOPLES INVITES PROPOSALS

to find a new and original logo design for the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples.

Entrants should keep in mind these basic requirements:

- the logo should be a reflection of the future, of a renewed relationship between the Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal peoples of Canada;
- the concept should be representative of all Aboriginal Peoples, status, treaty and non-status Indians, Metis and Inuit, women, men, elders and youth;
- the design should be simple and eloquent, and lend itself well to a variety of visual applications, for example, letterhead, banner/backdrop, or portable display;
- while any colour scheme is acceptable, bear in mind that the design must translate well into black and white, such as for photocopying.

The successful design will be selected in January 1992 by the Commissioners themselves, and will become the legal, copyrighted property of the Commission. All other proposals will be returned to originators.

The successful designer will receive a cash award of \$2000.

Your original proposal must be received at the offices of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples, at the address below, by no later than close of business (17:00 h. local time), 13 January 1992.

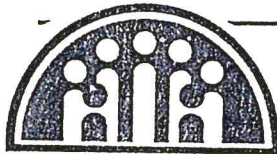

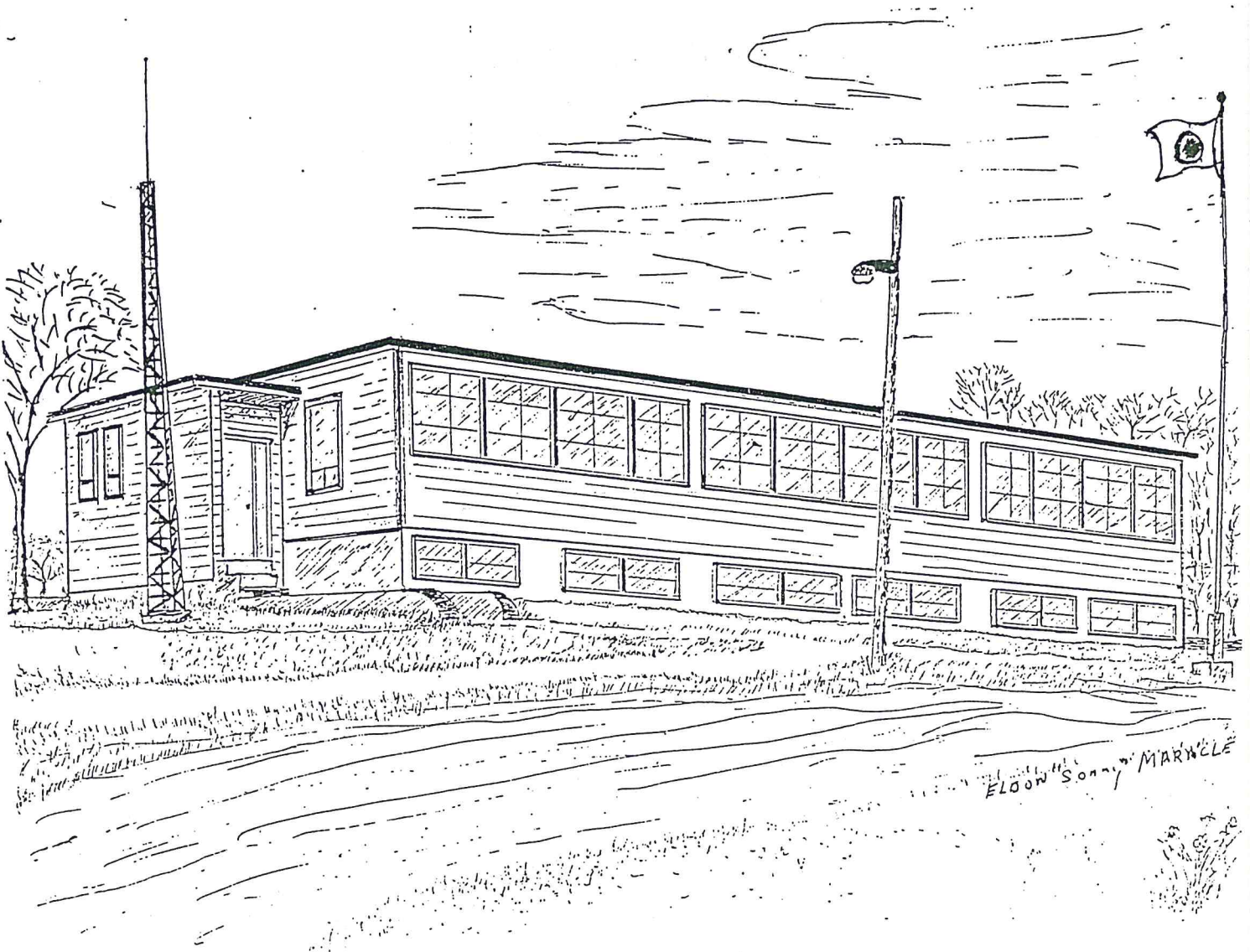

The Mohawk Administration Office is located three kilometres off of highway # 49 on the York Road. The building was the original Quinte Mohawk School which was built in 1954-55. Renovated in 1974 it has served as the second Administration Office since Tyendinaga Mohawk Council started controlling their own affairs in 1956.

Often the cause is related to the Christmas tree or its decorations, overloaded circuits, improper use of the fireplace, and holiday cooking and entertaining.

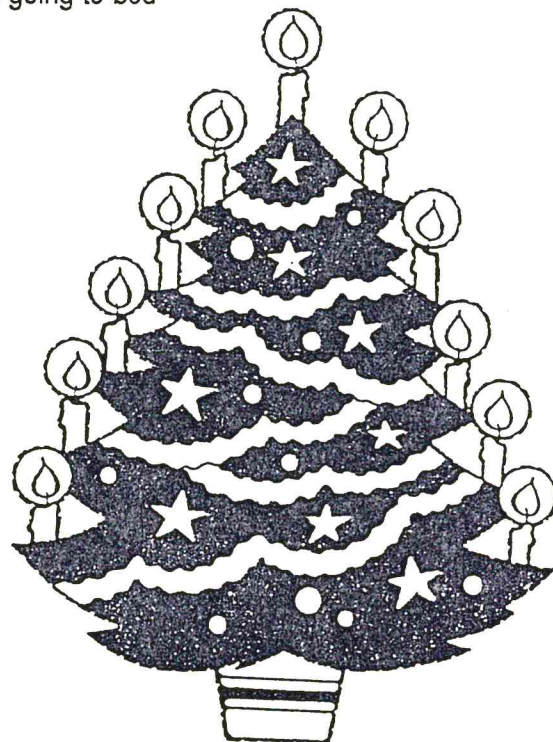
IT COULD HAPPEN TO YOU !

- * Add water daily to keep moisture in the tree
- * Keep it in a cool place away from heat register, fire place or radiator
- * Tie, or otherwise secure tree so it can't be knocked over by pets or small children
- * Do not smoke near tree
- * Before using lights on the tree make sure they are C.S.A. or U.L. listed
- * Never use more than three strings of lights on 1 circuit
- * Be able to turn off the tree lights without reaching or crawling under the tree
- * Do not leave the lights on if you leave the house or when going to bed
- * If you have an artificial tree, be sure it is flame resistant
- * Don't burn paper and boxes in the fireplace

If you follow these suggestions you will reduce the chance of Fire in your home over the holidays.

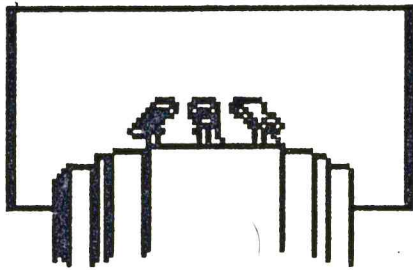

PASTOR'S PULPIT

WHAT IS THE SIGN?

Ever had to meet with someone at a particular place, but didn't know what they looked like? The agreement was that there would be an identification to allow you to know each other. Perhaps a colour of coat, or some distinguishable item of clothing. Most likely we have all been through some similar life circumstance.

The Bible depicts Jesus being approached by religious people of his day, with the intent of testing Jesus. Matthew 16:1 says these men asked Jesus for a SIGN. It does not tell us what kind of a sign it was, whether to prove Jesus as the Son of God, his authority as God, or to depict the world's end. We are not told.

BUT THE SAD PART OF IT ALL IS THIS. THESE PEOPLE ASKED THE ONE WHO WAS BORN IN A MANAGER, BORN OF A VIRGIN MOTHER MARY, BORN OF THE PRECISENESS OF A PROPHECY TO THIS BIRTH, BORN UNDER THE BRIGHT STAR OF BETHLEHEM, FOR A SIGN.
