SUMMER CANADA 1982

The summer student employment program will be underway once again beginning May 3, 1982. As in past years I must stress the importance of registering at the local Manpower offices as soon as possible. All students must have a social insurance number or must have applied for one before applying to the Band for summer employment.

Also as in the past employment will be set in different locations throughout the area (basically between Napanee and Belleville.)

Applications for summer employment will be available at Moira Secondary (Mike Brant's office) and also at the Band Office. Wages this year are \$140.00 per week for non-construction and \$150.00 per week for construction work.

When filling out your applications I would like you to give three preferences to the type of work you would like to do during the summer. You may not consider this important but for anyone thinking of a future career, it could set them up in a job relating to the type of work he or she may be interested in. EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Recent discussions by District Staff (Indian Affairs) with Parks Canada, Trent Waterway, Georgian Bay Island National Parks and St. Lawrence Island National Park revealed that a number of part and full-time positions will be advertised shortly.

All applicants must be registered with their local Manpower office now and follow-up with an application as opportunities become available. Parks Canada already employ a number of Native people, who, through their own initiative and with no outside assistance, are now employed in satisfying positions. This has encouraged Parks Canada to give greater consideration to others interested in full or part-time employment off the Reserve.
