

NEW SCHOOL FOR SANDY LAKE FIRST NATION

SANDY LAKE, ONT., December 23, 1993 -- The Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, Ronald Irwin, and M.P. for Kenora-Rainy River, Robert Nault, today announced the construction of a new school project for the Sandy Lake First Nation.

"This new facility will enhance the level of education to meet the needs of Canada's youngest and fastest growing population," said Mr. Irwin.

The school, operated and maintained by the Sandy Lake First Nation, will accommodate up to 297 Grade 5-10 students. It will include 12 classrooms, a library/resource centre, an auditorium/gymnasium as well as administrative offices. Sandy Lake First Nation is planning to occupy the new school by September 1995. Furthermore, it is expected that fifty per cent of the students from the nearby community of Keewaywin will attend school at Sandy Lake.

The Sandy Lake First Nation is located approximately 50 km east of the Ontario/Manitoba border and has an on-reserve population of approximately 1,400. It intends to maximize the benefits that the construction of the \$9.3 million school will provide by forming a joint venture between Sandy Lake Community Development Service Corporation and a general contractor.

"Projects like the construction of the Sandy Lake School enable Aboriginal communities to develop important training, employment and economic opportunities for their people", noted Mr. Nault.

Mr. Irwin added, "Our government's commitment to investing in Aboriginal people will benefit all Canadians."

DIAND AND THE MOKAKIT EDUCATION RESEARCH ASSOCIATION LAUNCH ABORIGINAL HEROES PROJECT

VANCOUVER (December 10, 1993) — Students, teachers, University of British Columbia (UBC) Faculty, British Columbia Chiefs, federal and provincial officials, and representatives of the Mokakit Education Research Association were among those who gathered in the UBC Longhouse today to launch *Courageous Spirits* — *Aboriginal Heroes of Our Children*.

Courageous Spirits is a book of essays accompanied by a teacher's guide — the result of a 1992 nationwide writing contest developed by Mokakit and sponsored by the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development (DIAND).

Students of Aboriginal ancestry from all grade levels across the country were invited to submit stories, essays, plays and poems in which they described their Aboriginal "hero". Schools selected one winner in each category — grades K–3, 4–7 and 8–12 — and forwarded those entries to Mokakit for final judging. Twenty winners were selected by the four judges. In addition, entries were encouraged from students who wanted their writing considered, but were not interested in entering competitively. More than half the stories were selected from those entries.

The book of essays is accompanied by a teacher's guide designed to help teachers introduce research methods to complement reading, social studies, writing and other areas of study in the classroom.

"Aboriginal children across Canada have written stories of determination, hope and survival, and they know instinctively that true heroism is not about wealth, or power, or station of birth. It is about character, courage and moral values. It's about soul. Their stories are truly inspirational," said B.C. Regional Director General John Watson, representing Indian Affairs and Northern Development Minister Ron Irwin.

"This book celebrates and praises the efforts of young writers from every corner of Canada who told us about their heroes," said Jo-ann Archibald, President of Mokakit and Director of the First Nations House of Learning at the University of British Columbia. "Our hearts were touched by their beautiful stories."

Mr. Watson told the young authors: "Courageous Spirits shows us that heroes are not only born of myths and legends. They are our mothers, our fathers, our peers, and our elders. The students themselves are heroes, in a sense, for providing children across Canada with role models they can look up to, and for helping us to recognize the potential we have within ourselves to realize our dreams."

We must start to get back to what life really means. What this whole wide world is really all about. About the ONE, who put it all together. And that includes you and I.


