

#### TURTON PENN LEASE DISPUTE RESOLVED

Ottawa, Ontario (July 4, 1991) -- The Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte First Nation and the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development (DIAND) jointly announced today that they have reached an agreement whereby lands held under the 1835 Turton Penn lease agreement will be gradually returned to Indian control.

Shirley Martin, Minister of State (Transport), who in her previous role as Minister of State for DIAND was instrumental in getting the negotiations restarted, signed the agreement on behalf of Tom Siddon, Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development. Minister Martin said, "I am happy that significant progress has been made in settling these longstanding differences. I believe the agreement will lead to a fair and just settlement which responds to the needs of all parties."

"Today's signing underscores Canada's commitment to resolve outstanding grievances and to improve conditions in aboriginal communities, in keeping with the Native Agenda", Mr. Siddon added. "This agreement is testament to the progress that can be achieved when First Nations and governments work together to solve outstanding aboriginal concerns."

Chief Earl Hill agreed, "Since this issue has been outstanding for approximately 20 years and this has been the first sincere face-to-face negotiations that Tyendinaga has received, it definitely shows a commitment by both parties to act in good faith to resolve outstanding Native claims."

In 1835, a 999 year lease of 200 acres of the Tyendinaga Reserve was issued, at an annual rent of 30 barrels of flour. The lease has long been a source of concern for Tyendinaga and the residents of the lease area, known today as Shannonville, near Belleville, Ontario.

Under the agreement signed today, the Crown will consider individual offers to sell leasehold interest in the Turton Penn lease at fair market value. As soon as an individual sale is finalized, the remaining term of lease will be cancelled.

The agreement also provides for the immediate transfer of lands known as the "McTaggart and Latchford properties" to the existing Tyendinaga Indian Reserve No. 38.

Following signing of the agreement, senior officials from Indian Affairs and Northern Development and Public Works Canada will hold an open meeting this evening (July 4, 1991) with the residents of Shannonville to explain the government's interest in lessee's offers to sell their leasehold properties.


Residents of Shannonville will not be forced to sell their leasehold interest but any resident who chooses to sell will be offered a fair price for both the land and improvements, based on independent appraisals. All purchases will be handled by Public Works Canada. Negotiations are expected to begin soon.



the community in providing improved services.


The survey has the support of Council and was initiated as a follow-up to the Skills Quinte "Public Interviewer" Job Development Program.

#### Daycare Conference

### Walking in your child's moccasins

Sometimes it is difficult to remember what it was like to be a child, a little person. Children have feelings and needs just like other human beings. They often do not know how to deal with their feelings. This can be difficult for the parent or caregiver who may have grown up with the belief that it is wrong to get angry or to cry, and that it might even be dangerous to do so.

Children expect to be cared for and protected. It is up to the parent or caregiver to take care of these little people who do not have the ability yet to care for themselves.

One way to learn how to care for your child is to put yourself in your child's moccasins. Children are human beings and want to be respected and listened to. If you do not know how your child is feeling, ask. It may be uncomfortable at first, but you will get better at it as time goes on. Children are usually honest and will tell you directly. This will enable you to give proper attention to your child at the moment. Also, it opens up a line of communication between you and your child that will be valuable as your child grows up.

It is everyone's responsibility to keep Tyendinaga Territory clean, so PLEASE help us to preserve our Territory.



For a good non-toxic WINDOW CLEANER mix 3 tablespoons white vinegar with a quart of water - you'll be surprised at the grease cutting power. Newaprint makes a streak-free rag for wiping your windows.

Now that hot weather is here you might want to try a "NAVY SHOWER". Instead of letting the water run the whole time, turn it off while you lather up. You can save about half the water used in a conventional shower.
