In follow-up to your recent request regarding the above noted topic, please be advised of the following information.

This will reconfirm that Public Works Canada has acquired Parcel # 35B within the Turton Penn lease area on behalf of the Department In accordance with the of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada. Turton Penn Lease Memorandum of Understanding, vacant possession of the land including leasehold improvements was returned to you on July 13, 1993. All pertinent property transfer documents and environmental transfer assessment were provided on August 13, 1993.

This will also reconfirm that agreement was reached on November 2, 1994 with you and Council to have the house, located on Parcel 35B, demolished and removed at INAC's expense. The reason for demolition was due to the general dilapidated condition of the house and the UNSAFE structural integrity.

Public Works Canada will be managing the demolition and removal of said structure within the next 2 - 3 months. Should the house in fact be occupied at the time of demolition it will be Council's responsibility to take appropriate measures to have any occupants removed. The District Office will continue to work cooperatively with you and Council and provide ongoing support and assistance within the authorities of this department.

The costs for use is the major revision. This revision was necessary in order to cover all the costs of the bus: maintenance, insurance, wear and tear on the buses. The Busing Program can no longer assume the costs of the extra uses for the buses.

The Rentee is responsible for the bus driver's salary, meals, accommodations, entry fees to events; bridge fees, toll fees, parking fees; refueling of bus and mileage based on a rate of \$0.50 per kilometre.

An application form <u>must be completed</u> before a bus can be rented.

GARY FARMER JOINS BOARD OF ONTARIO ARTS COUNCIL

Toronto, June 16, 1995 -- Actor and publisher Gary Dale Farmer has joined the

board of the Ontario Arts Council (OAC). With extensive experience in film,

television, theatre and radio, Farmer is also a producer, and editor-in-chief of the

"We are particularly pleased to see Gary Farmer on the board which has become more representative of the arts community including a broader cultural make-up," says OAC chair Paul Hoffert. "It is important that OAC's board reflect the continuum from the not-for-profit to the commercial arts sectors which form part of Ontario's cultural fabric. Gary is not only a very successful performing artist, but he understands the importance of giving back to the community."

Farmer can be seen in several films currently in theatres throughout North America: Henry and Verlin, Tales from The Crypt, Demon Knight and Powwow Highway, which won the Best Film Award at the American Indian Film Festival where Farmer also won an award for Best Actor. He recently completed the feature film Dead Man, directed by Jim Jarmusch and co-starring Johnny Depp.

Farmer started on stage in 1976, working almost exclusively in theatre for the first eight years. Some of the Candian plays in which he has appeared include: Michael Hollingsworth's *Village of the Small Huts*, Elaine Coleman's *Blue City Skies*, and the 1989 and 1990 productions of Tomson Highway's *Dry Lips Oughta Move to Kapuskasing*, which amassed seven Dora Mavor Moore Awards in 1989, including a Best Actor nomination for Gary's performance.

As Farmer learned about the strength of acting and its empowerment, he became fascinated by media, especially in its implications for his own people. Born on the Six Nations Reserve near Brantford, Ontario, on June 12, 1953, Farmer is a Cayuga of the Wolf Clan. "I grew up with a strong political sense of who I was, but not a strong cultural sense. I became tremendously concerned about the survival of indigenous culture and aboriginal language. Knowing what I missed compelled me to help Indian media stand on its own. This is what pushed me into producing for radio and television as well as into publishing."

Farmer was particularly drawn to radio, because it was inexpensive to produce. Having already performed in many radio dramas, he produced and directed *Jenny's Song*, a radio drama about AIDS for the National Native American AIDS Media Consortium and *Sugar Blues, Too Many Diabetic Indians*, for broadcast on native community radio stations in North America.

Since 1989, Farmer has served as speaker and lecturer on Native communications and related subjects, including: literacy, environmental advocacy and community activism. In his new OAC role, Farmer advocates, "the work of our native artists and other artists needs to be made more broadly available to communities outside urban areas, to help people gain cultural understanding and a sense of themselves."

OAC's 12 volunteer board members are appointed from communities across the province by the Lieutenant Governor in Council for a three year term. They are responsible for ensuring that OAC's grants are awarded in a fair and equitable manner and that its policies reflect current needs and community concerns. OAC is an agency of the Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Recreation.



ABORIGINAL BUSINESS VENTURES PROGRAM

The Ohwistha Capital Corporation has been approved and authorized to deliver the Aboriginal Business Ventures Program. We will process, give final approval, disburse and administer the loan directly from our offices.

This program is designed to assist residents 18 years or older, with a valid Social Insurance Number in starting or expanding a business on their First Nation. The loan is a personal loan guaranteed by the province of Ontario of up to \$15,000 for a term of five years. In the first year you repay interest only at the rate of prime plus 1% on the loan amount. In the second year, you begin to pay down the loan based on a negotiated repayment schedule. You must make a equity contribution equal to at least 50% of the loan amount with your own cash equity of at least 10% and the remaining 40% can come from other sources such as equipment, Band or Agency loans or grants. This works out to \$1,500 of your own money as equity and \$5,000 from other sources.

WELLNESS

Taking Charge of Your Health

Wellness is more than not being sick--it's an approach to health that aims to reduce your risk of serious illness. Why wellness? Because the way we live has a lot to do with our health. Unhealthy lifestyles can cause life-threatening conditions such as heart disease, cancer, diabetes, and stroke. Yet 80% of these "lifestyle diseases" can be prevented. By recognizing and reducing your health risks, you can start making wellness a way of life. Native people traditionally practiced a wellness way of life as shown in the principles listed below.

TRADITIONAL INDIAN PRINCIPLES OF HEALTH

- 1. Good health is a gift from the Creator.
- 2. When we show respect for ourselves, our bodies, and our health, we show appreciation of the Creators gifts.
- 3. Good health is ours when we live in a balanced relationship with the Earth and the Natural World.
- 4. Since the coming of the white man, we have forgotten many of our ways. If we are to survive, we must put the first three principles into practice daily.



BE SUN SMART



Skin cancer is a killer and it's on the increase. You need to protect your skin from the sun every day, all year round. Here are some facts to keep in mind:

- Babies under one year should be kept out of direct sunlight to protect them from sun damage and also to prevent dehydration and sunstroke. Keep them protected in a covered stroller, under an umbrella or in the shade. DO NOT USE A SUNSCREEN ON BABIES UNDER SIX MONTHS OF AGE.
- Even on cloudy days, you still need protection Up to 80% of the sun's rays can penetrate light clouds, mist and fog. Eyes need protection—wear sunglasses that filter out UV rays.



- Sunhats with a wide brim (3" wide on all sides), long-sleeved shirts and pants offer excellent protection.
- UVA rays—ultraviolet rays that contribute to skin aging, wrinkling and probably development of skin cancer. UVB rays—ultraviolet rays that give you a sunburn. CHOOSE A SUNSCREEN THAT STATES IT SCREENS OUT BOTH.
- Never use baby oil as a sunscreen. The oil will intensify the effect of the sun and cause you to burn faster.
- Sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher is recommended. Apply it to all areas exposed to the sun, paying particular attention to ears, nose and upper foot area. Re-apply often especially after swimming or perspiring heavily. If possible apply sunscreen 30-45 minutes before going out in the sun.
- Medications can cause an adverse reaction to sunlight. Be sure to check with your Dr. about any side-effects which may occur when exposed to the sun.
- Avoid the sun between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. as this is the time when the sun's rays are most intense.
- Remember, reflected light off water, concrete, snow and san can cause serious sunburns.
- Teach your children sun safe habits and set a good example yourself. If we encourage sun safety in our children, it will be easily accepted as part of their lifestyle.

SUNSCREEN

FACT SHEET

- Skin is exposed to natural ultraviolet rays from the sun and artificial ultraviolet rays that are emitted by sunlamps and tanning parlour equipment.
- There are two different types of ultraviolet rays that can damage skin: Ultraviolet A (UVA) and Ultraviolet B (UVB).
- © UVB rays which penetrate the outer most layer of the skin causing sunburn, are known to cause cancer.
- UVA rays penetrate even deeper into the skin, producing damage that can not be seen or felt. These rays can cause skin to age prematurely and may suppress the immune system and cause cancer.

What is a Sunscreen?

- A sunscreen is anything that protects the skin from ultraviolet ravs.
- Skin can be protected from UV rays by using an umbrella, wearing a hat or clothing.
- There are also oils, lotions and creams which are formulated to protect skin from ultraviolet rays. These include:
 - Sunblocks which create a barrier that reflects ultraviolet

light, e.g. zinc oxide or titanium dioxide.

- Sunscreens which absorb the ultraviolet rays and prevent penetration through the skin, e.g. PABA and its derivatives, benzephones, cinnamates, dibenzolymethanes and salicylates.
- Quick tanning products (in lotion or capsule form), which give your skin a tanned colour, do not protect the skin from ultraviolet rays.

What is S.P.F.?

- S.P.F. stands for the Sun Protection Factor contained in a sunscreen. S.P.F. refers to the ability of the product to protect skin from burning.
- S.P.F. is calculated under laboratory conditions and is a

- guide to the amount of protection from ultraviolet rays that is provided.
- The higher the number of the S.P.F., the more protection your skin receives and the longer you are able to stay in the sun before burning or seeking cover.
- For example, if it normally takes 10 minutes for skin to become reddened without protection, an S.P.F. of 15 would provide 150 minutes of protection from burning.
- An S.P.F. of 15 blocks over 92% of the UVB rays.
- Skin may still tan even when using a sunscreen since all chemical sunscreens allow some ultraviolet rays to penetrate.
- Repeated applications of the sunscreen will not provide extra

protection for longer exposure. However, if your skin has become wet through swimming or perspiring the sunscreen can and should be reapplied to offer renewed protection

How to Choose a Sunscreen

- Although sunscreens may have an S.P.F. ranging anywhere from 2 to 50, the Canadian Dermatology Association and the Canadian Cancer Society recommend an S.P.F. of 15 or higher.
- Those with skin that has a tendency to burn should use a sunscreen with a higher S.P.F.. i.e. fair-haired and fair-skinned people.
 The more likely you are to burn, the higher the S.P.F. you need.
- Read the ingredients listed on the sunscreen label carefully and make sure that the product offers both UVA and UVB protection.
- © Consult your doctor or pharmacist for help in choosing a sunscreen.
- When applying a sunscreen, follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Look for the Canadian Dermatology Association's seal of approval.




The public is invited to join artists and museum members at a 2:00 pm. opening. At 3:00 pm. the first of the discussion
