BAND PLANNER/PROJECT DEVELOPMENT OFFICER  
MOHAWKS OF THE BAY OF QUINTE BAND

JOB DESCRIPTION

GENERAL

Under the direction of the Chief and Council of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte and supervision of the B.E.D.O./Band Office Manager, the Band Planner is to provide planning advice and service and to encourage socio-economic development planning by and for the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte Band. This advice and service includes but is not limited to the areas of comprehensive community planning, physical development planning, site analysis and design, environmental planning and project development and implementation.

SPECIFIC DUTIES

The successful applicant will:

1. Assist the Chief and Council in the development of those Band projects which have been previously identified and consulting feasibility studies completed but not implemented to date. A short list of these projects include:
  - (a) drainage improvement of the Reserve;
  - (b) Band economic development loan fund;
  - (c) Roads improvement;
  - (d) Sr. Citizen housing;
  - (e) Water/Sewage servicing of the Band industrial park; and
  - (f) Bayshore water/sewage servicing.
2. Complete the Band planning community information mobile. Subsequently, to obtain the community's input to the Council's proposed Band comprehensive community plan and under Council's direction clarify/revise the Band's plan to reflect this input so that final approval by the Band and Council can be obtained and implementation begin.

SPECIFIC DUTIES cont'd

3. Initiate relevant background studies and evaluations on any facet of the M.B.Q. community in order to facilitate the completion and adoption of the Band's comprehensive plan.
4. On an "as required" basis, provide planning advice and service to the Band Office Manager and Band Staff; this to assist in the effective planning and management of the Band operations.
5. On an "as required" basis, prepare plot plans, physical development plans, lot layouts, etc.; this in support of the many submissions and proposals prepared by the M.B.Q. staff and programs.

QUALIFICATIONS

- good knowledge of rural/community/urban planning or related discipline with basic training in cartography/drafting, statistics;
- good knowledge of basic theories, principles, methods and techniques of community planning and community development;
- general knowledge of economics and commerce as they relate to small business development;
- knowledge of federal and provincial legislation and programs that relate to Indian people;
- progressively responsible experience in (a) the development of business proposals and applications/submissions for funding; and (b) project management, contract tendering and administration.

ABILITIES

- verbal, written and graphic communications skills;
- self starter; ability to work with a minimum of direction and supervision;
- results oriented.

- commensurate with education and experience.
