INFORMATION FOR MBQ HOUSEHOLDS CONNECTED TO THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM

BACKGROUND:

The sanitary sewer system servicing homes along Hwy #2, Church Lane, Bayshore Road and in the Huron Brant Drive subdivision collects the sewage and transports it by gravity sewer mains to the pump stations located in the subdivision and on Bayshore Road. The sewage is then pumped to the Deseronto Wastewater Treatment Plant for treatment prior to discharge to the Bay. The Deseronto Plant is a typical sewage plant, designed to remove pollutants and pathogens before discharging to the Bay of Quinte.

Operations at the plant rely heavily on bacteria and organisms to break down and consume waste material. Any toxic waste entering the sewer system could upset the operation of the Deseronto Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), preventing adequate cleaning of the wastewater before it is discharged to the Bay of Quinte.

Examples of household hazardous wastes that should not be discharged to the sanitary sewer systems include:

- paint / stain
- paint thinners
- varsol
- oil
- gasoline
- other liquid waste products that are labeled with a poisonous or flammable symbol.

If the WWTP receives toxic waste, it may kill off the organisms that break down the incoming sewage. Such a discharge is considered serious since the WWTP cannot effectively treat incoming sewage and therefore will be out of compliance with environmental regulations and the receiving body of water could be adversely affected.

It should also be noted that residents should not put clothing or rags (such as J-cloths) into the toilets as these items could adversely affect pumping station components such as pumps/impellers causing sewage back-ups.

Hydraulic loading impacts

Typically, wastewater treatment plants are designed to treat normal or low flows that occur during dry periods with the occurrence of minor storm events.

Infiltration and inflow are the technical terms referring to rainwater and/or groundwater that enter the sanitary sewer system through such sources as improper Sump Pump connections, cracked pipes, leaky manholes, or roof gutter downspouts.

Sump pump connections can cause adverse environmental impacts; for example, increased sewer flows can cause sewage bypass events. A bypass event allows raw sewage to flow into the bay untreated.

Why are infiltration and inflow big problems for the Sewer System?

- Sump pumps connected to the sewer system is a source of groundwater infiltration into the sewer system. This additional water can put extra strain on the pumping stations, which means shortened pump lifespan and significant capital cost to replace or upgrade.
- Regular operations during high flow situations can be adversely impacted due to the reduced capacity caused by the additional flows from sump pumps Reduced pumping station capacity could result in sewage back-ups.
- When the wastewater collection system is hydraulically overloaded, the flows increase requiring extra time and materials to treat, thus invoiced costs from the Town may increase.
- Lastly, the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte have a defined sewage flow capacity.
 Additional flows reduce overall capacity that could possibly restrict future connections and development for the community.

To Summarize

The sanitary sewers exist to transport domestic sewage to the Deseronto Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Sanitary sewers are not intended for the disposal of hazardous wastes. Putting household hazardous wastes (like paint thinner or oil) down toilets or drains will negatively impact the process at the sewage treatment plants. Ultimately, these toxic wastes can end up in the receiving waters and harm the environment. These are to be disposed of at approved locations only. Finally, sump pump connections significantly increase flows into the sewer system which places hydraulic pressure on the pumping stations. Increased flows cause pumps to work harder and more often as a result may cause premature pump failures which increases the cost to operate the system.

Please be advised that any sump pumps connected to the sewer system in the Bayshore Road, Hwy #2 and Church Lane area must be disconnected and rerouted in an effort to reduce infiltration into the sanitary system. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.



This one-year certificate program is a launching pad for entry into administrative and supervisory careers in almost any industry. Graduates have gone on to positions as administrative assistants, supervisors, office technicians and office managers in fields as diverse as finance, human resources, program delivery, retail and service delivery.

LAW CLERK - Starting in Toronto

This one-year diploma program provides knowledge and expertise related to the management of legal issues in First Nations communities, including land claims, jurisdiction issues, policy and development, restorative justice, criminal law, family law, ethics and Aboriginal customary law. Students in this program will get an overall introduction to law within the context of First Nations communities.

This two-year diploma program offers courses that focus on personal growth, organization and community development, improved communications skills around program planning, interviewing and counseling, family and group work. BREASTFEEDING CIRCLE

What does breastfeeding have to do with fathers?
Fathers-to-be may feel as if they are on the sidelines as far as breastfeeding is concerned. However, once the baby arrives, many men find themselves on the front lines of breastfeeding support.
Research has shown that support by the baby's father is a key factor in establishing and continuing breastfeeding.

How to help: What mothers have said ...

- "I probably wouldn't have made it through those first tiring and emotional weeks if it weren't for my husband and his sense of humour."
- "He really took care of me in those early weeks. He nurtured me while I nurtured the baby."
- "He held one twin, skin-to-skin, in a sling while I nursed the other one. This eliminated the crying and lowered my stress level!"
- "He kept me company during the day and in the middle of the night. It was so lovely to have a chance to just sit and talk, a time for us to reconnect."
- "He brought me a glass of water each time I sat down to nurse the baby."
- "My spouse saw me struggling with breastfeeding. He
 encouraged me, saying 'Hang in there; you can do it.' He
 didn't leap to the conclusion we needed formula. That
 strengthened my resolve, and made all the difference."

How to help: What fathers have said ...

- "At first I thought I would be left out if I couldn't feed the baby. Then I found there were many other ways I could bond with him. If he was crying with a wet diaper, I could fix it and make him happy again. If he was in pain with a burp, I could fix that too. If he needed to nurse, I brought him to his mother. The health and happiness that I know came from breast-feeding are worth the world and I'm glad I could help that happen."
- "I'm glad I felt strongly about breastfeeding before the baby was born, because after he arrived I had to step in to protect my partner's right and ability to feed the baby herself. I was amazed at how hospital proce



Ask the Doctor:

My question is:

At what age can children stop wearing bicycle helmets? We mostly ride around the yard and don't really ride that far down the road. If we go for big rides I put them in the Chariot as they are enclosed in it. I don't wear one and my kids fight wearing a helmet as well.

~ Todd from Belleville

Hi Todd,

You should always wear a helmet when cycling even if it is around the yard or driveway at home. It is just as easy to fall around home and hit your head as it is out on a road. According to Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, 91% of bicyclists killed in 2009 reportedly weren't wearing helmets, the same percentage as 2008. Also in 2009, 2% of traffic fatalities was due to bicycle accidents.

There are over 500,000 bicycle accidents a year in North America. Every year the estimated number of bicycling head injuries requiring hospitalization exceeds the total of all the head injury cases related to baseball, football, skateboards, kick scooters, horseback riding, snowboarding, ice hockey, in-line skating and lacrosse. Estimated indirect costs for injuries to unhelmeted cyclists are \$2.3 billion yearly reported from the Snell Memorial Foundation.



If your helmet can do this and allow you to walk away, what happens when you don't wear one?

Why chance it when helmet use has been estimated to reduce head injury risk by at least 85%. I know when I was growing up we didn't have bike helmets and I have the stitches and honestly can say a few less brain cells due to some crashes on my bike. Safety equipment has evolved enormously in all sports to help reduce all types of injury. The bike is no different.

Please do me a favor and wear your helmet and make your kids wear them, even if you pull them around in a chariot. Accidents happen and can't be undone, whether you get hurt and can't help them or they get hurt and you can't help them. Ride safe.
