POSITION: Band Economic Development Officer - July 1981 -March 1982

SALARY: \$270.00 Weekly

LOCATION: Mohawk Band Office, Tyendinga Indian Reserve, R. R. #1, Deseronto, Ontario

BASIC REQUIREMENTS: - college graduate from a finance, accounting or business related course or equivalent work experience

- knowledge of finance and business terms a must

- work experience in an administrative or business position would be helpful to aid in this particular job

DUTIES: The complete organization, planning, development and evaluation of projects for the Band and individual Band members interested in a business venture. Developing a community plan for the Band Council. This would take in manufacturing possibilities, tourism and industry.

Training for this position will be provided by the Band Council and the Peterborough District Superintendent of Economic and Employment Development or his delegates.

POST-SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT REQUIRED

A student is required for door to door survey work, beginning in mid June. This will be a Drug and Alcohol Program Feasibility Study, so someone currently enrolled in a D & A counsellor course or relative course such as Behavioural Science would be preferable.
