EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

GROUNDS KEEPER - Quinte Mohawk School

The Band Council wishes to invite all interested Band members to submit proposals for the following service contract:

- The service contract is to quote a complete cost price to supply to the Band Council the labour and knowledge necessary to perform the following duties:
- 1. Undertake to grade, smooth and effect regular repairs to the track and amphitheater and other physical plant facilities exterior to the school building;
- 2. Insure that all grass areas of the school property are cut to the specifications of the Chief Maintenance Officer;
- 3. Trim all grass and undergrowth in areas that are not mower accessible such as: around trees, curbs and track installations;
- 4. Tend and maintain such flower and display areas as required by the Chief Maintenance Officer and Principal;
- 5. Survey, evaluate and make recommendations for the upgrading, repairs and improvements to school property;
- 6. Provide such care to new plantings as required;
- 7. Make recommendations and reports to the Chief Maintenance Officer for major work beyond the scope of this job description and assist in the decisions as to the appropriate purchase of necessary materials pertaining to the care of the property;
- 8. Perform daily safety and maintenance checks on all equipment and related materials required to fulfill the undertakings of the job description;
- 9. To undertake light maintenance such as tractor and accessory repairs, welding repairs essential and light carpentry;
- 10. To perform other related duties as required by the Chief Maintenance Officer and/or Principal.

DURATION: 40 hour work week for 12 weeks

SUPERVISION: Band Council, or its representative, with direct supervision by the Chief Maintenance Officer, Quinte Mohawk School.

Each proposal will be evaluated on its merit and the lowest tender will not necessarily be accepted. Proposals for this service contract will be accepted until 4:00 p.m. June 15, 1982 at the Band Office. Please direct them to the attention of Terry Bernhardt, Office Manager & Financial Co-Ordinator.

The contract will be expected to begin approximately June 21, 1982.

LANDS RESEARCHER TRAINEE

Due to the future retirement of Melville Hill, the Band Council wishes to invite applications for a proposed job opportunity with the Band for a trainee as a Lands Researcher. The person will train for a period of 39 weeks in the Band Office and in the Office of Peterborough District office of the Department of Indian Affairs.

Some of the duties include:

1. Researching present and future land claims that the Band Council directs;
2. Obtaining of signatures, Band Council Resolution information;
3. Arrange appointments for District Reserves and trusts personnel;
4. Forwarding completed documents to District office for approval and further processing.

Upon completion of training, the Band will hire this person full-time to fill the present Land Researcher's position.

Please note that the position is being advertised so that the successful applicant may train for an adequate period prior to full take over of the duties of the Researcher. This job is subject to the funds being approved by the Department of Indian Affairs.

LANDS CLERK

Subject to approval of funding, the Band will accept applications for the position of a trainee for Lands Clerk. The position is to assist the Lands Researcher in the clerical duties of the position.

Duties include:

Typing of Band Council Resolutions, Certificates of Possession, Lands Transfers, leases, etc.

This training period will last for 38 weeks.

NOTE: Both of the Lands jobs mentioned above are subject to the Band receiving approval for the funding. Applications will be accepted for both positions until 4:00 p.m. June 25, 1982 at the Band Office. The salary remains undetermined at this time as the funding approval is yet to be received.
