 - work experience in an administrative or business position would be helpful to aid in this particular job

Duties: The complete organization, planning, development and evaluation of projects for the Band and individual Band members interested in a business venture. Developing a community plan for the Band Council. This would take in manufacturing possibilities, tourism and industry.

Training for this position will be provided by the Band Council and the Peterborough District Superintendent of Economic and Employment Development or his delegates.

Summer Employment

The student summer employment program for 1981 will be beginning June 22. This year a total of \$42,231.00 has been approved by Indian Affairs and the Canada Employment and Immigration Office. The jobs this year will be made available to students from Grade 9 through post-secondary. Everyone will be paid at the rate of \$3.25/hour (\$130.00 weekly) excluding two program managers. There are a few jobs that will possibly begin during May, these will be made available to post-secondary students only. All students will be contacted well in advance for job interviews.

As it stands now a total of 25 jobs will be open. Applications are available at the Band office and with Mike Brant at Moira Secondary. All students must once again register with the Student Manpower office in Belleville (old Manpower centre) and must have their Social Insurance Numbers.

I'd like to apologize to the Grade 8 students for not having jobs available, hopefully next year something will be done for these students also. It has taken at least three years of complaining about wages and the hiring of secondary and post-secondary students to get the different departments to bring the wage scale into reality and to begin hiring at least at the Grade 9 level, so hang in there, there might be hope for funding for public school students in the future.

Please return your selection to the Band Office before May 15, 1981 at 4:00 p.m.

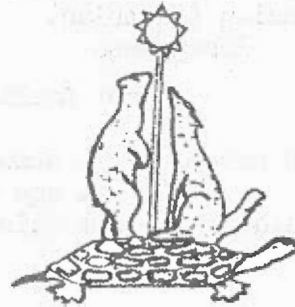

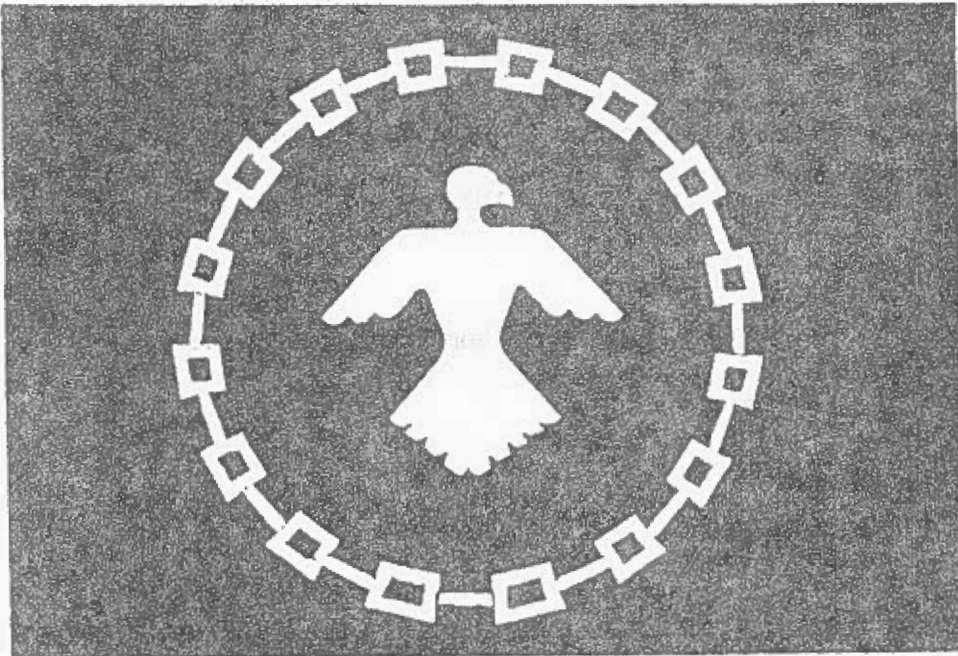
Red on yellow background.

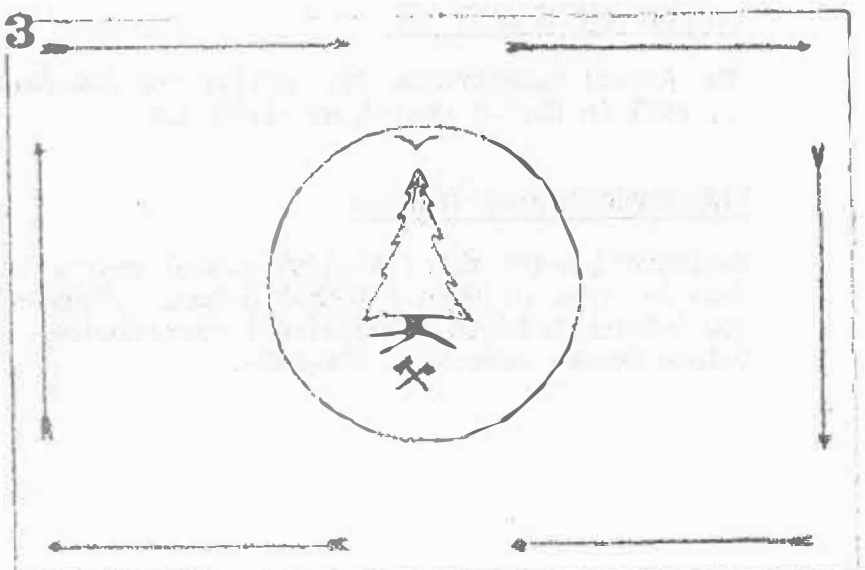
