SAFETY TIPS FOR CYCLISTS

DO'S

- DRIVE YOUR BIKE IN THE SAME DIRECTION AS TRAFFIC, ON THE RIGHT-HAND SIDE OF THE ROAD, SINGLE FILE.
- USE THE CORRECT HAND SIGNALS WHEN YOU WANT TO TURN, SLOW
- OBEY ALL TRAFFIC RULES, SIGNS AND LIGHTS.
- KEEP BOTH HANDS ON THE HANDLEBAR, EXCEPT WHEN YOU ARE SIGNALLING.
- WALK YOUR BIKE ACROSS BUSY INTERSECTIONS.
- WEAR LIGHT-COLOURED OR REFLECTIVE CLOTHING AT NIGHT, AND MAKE SURE YOUR BIKE HAS THE CORRECT SAFETY EQUIPMENT.
- STOP AND LOOK LEFT, THEN RIGHT THEN LEFT AGAIN BEFORE ENTERING TRAFFIC FROM A DRIVEWAY OR LANE.
- WATCH FOR ROAD OBSTACLES LIKE SEWER GRATES, BUMPS OR
- RECORD YOUR BIKE'S COMPLETE DESCRIPTION AND EVEN HAVE IT ENGRAVED. THIS MAKES THE BIKE EASIER TO IDENTIFY IF IT GETS
- CAREFULLY LOCK YOUR BIKE TO A SOLID OBJECT.
- ARE VERY CAREFUL OF PARKED CARS, BECAUSE THE DRIVERS COULD SUDDENLY OPEN THEIR DOORS IN YOUR PATH.

DONT'S

- RIDE TWO ON A BIKE.
- RACE WITH EACH OTHER, WITH CARS, TRUCKS OR BUSES.
- ATTACH CARS OR ANY OBJECTS TO YOUR BIKE
- HITCH RIDES BEHIND OTHER VEHICLES: BIKES, CARS OR TRUCKS.
- WEAVE IN AND OUT OF TRAFFIC.
- PERFORM STUNTS.
- CARRY PARCELS IN YOUR HANDS WHILE DRIVING YOUR BIKE.
- WEAR HEADPHONES OR LISTEN TO PORTABLE STEREOS WHEN DRIVING
- RIDE YOUR BIKE ON THE SIDEWALK UNLESS DESIGNATED BY THE CITY AS AN OFFICIAL BICYCLE PATH.

Takes little time to die behind the wheel

Statistics unearth scary facts about cars

group of attorneys whose specialty is personal injury and motor vehicle accident litigation. I've read and seen some terrible things in this business, and I am now an extremely cautious driver.

Will you please print the enclosed? I don't know who wrote it, but it certainly made an impression on me. Maybe seeing it will wake up some of those speeding, drunk or drugged drivers. — Legal Secretary

Dear Legal -- The essay you sent appeared in my column several years ago, but I am pleased to run it again. People have a tendency to forget the unpleasant stuff. Here it is: Heaven Can Wait

It takes 7/10ths of a second to kill a person in an automobile crash. Studies at Yale and Cornell universities provided a dramatic split-second chronology of what happens when a car rams into a tree at 55 mph.

At 1/10th of a second, the front bumper and grille collapse.

At 2/10ths of a second, the hood crumbles, rises and smashes into the windshield, and the grillwork disintegrates.

At 3/10ths of a second, the driver is sprung upright from his seat, his broken knees pressed against the dashboard and the steering wheel bends under his

At 4/10ths of a second, the front of his car is destroyed and dead still, but the rear end is still plunging forward at 55 mph. The half-ton motor crushes into the tree.

At 5/10ths of a second, the driver's fear-frozen hands bend the steering column into an almost vertical position, and he is impaled on the steering wheel shaft. Jagged steel punctures his lungs and arteries.

At 6/10ths of a second, the impact rips the shoes off his feet. The chassis



Try using music while you dust, vacuum, scrub, wash windows - do stretches while you watch TV etc.



Cancer Info

With April being Cancer Month, the CHRs have been extremely busy attempting to contact community women over 50 for the annual Breast Screening Program. This particular program was started 4 years ago with participants being driven to the Ontario Breast Screening Clinic in Kingston. We are now taking the women to the Belleville Clinic and to date, approximately 65 are participating in this program. We have found that the support of the CHRs and other women help make this experience a more positive one.

The CHRs have also done Breast Self Examination presentations to Elders and grade seven and eight girls at the Quinte Mohawk School. We hope that by openly discussing this very personal issue with females from all age groups, that we can dispell some of the fear and shame regarding our bodies.

While cancer, especially breast cancer is not a pleasant subject to discuss, studies have shown that one in ten women will develop breat cancer in their lifetime. Early detection is crucial in surviving this deadly disease.
