




SELF-EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE COMPONENT GUIDE FOR APPLICANTS

WHAT IS IT?

The Self-Employment Assistance Component (SEA) provides financial assistance for people who want to start their own business.

People who receive Unemployment Insurance (UI) or Social Assistance (SA) benefits normally lose those benefits when they start a business. If you are a UI claimant, the Self-Employment Assistance Component provides you with the greater of your regular UI benefits or a basic allowance. If you are entitled to Social Assistance benefits, you will receive a basic allowance. In both cases, the financial support can be provided for a maximum period of 52 weeks while you develop and implement your business plan.

WHO CAN APPI Y?

To qualify for the Self-Employment Assistance Component, you must meet the following conditions:

- normally reside in an area where the Self-Employment Assistance Component has been approved under the Community Development Program (check with your local Canada Employment Centre);
- be a qualified Unemployment Insurance Claimant or be eligible for (or in receipt of) Social Assistance benefits;

- be legally entitled to work in Canada;
- attend an orientation session with the Coordinator in your area (a Coordinator is a local community group that is funded by Employment and Immigration (EIC) to provide assistance to you in your pursuit of self-employment opportunities);
- have no previous participation in a self-employment assistance activity funded by EIC:
- agree to provide a business plan acceptable to EIC, showing potential for long term selfemployment;
- make a personal investment in the business of at least 25% (up to a maximum of \$4,000) in cash or other equity related to the operation of the business;
- start a new business or take over an existing business in which you had no prior ownership; and
- agree to work full-time on your business while you receive financial assistance.

WHAT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WILL YOU RECEIVE?

Under the SEA Component, if you have established a UI benefit

period, you will receive the greater of your regular UI entitlement or a basic allowance. You may also be entitled to supplementary allowances. This will be calculated by a local Canada Employment Centre official.

If you are eligible to receive Social Assistance you will receive a basic allowance. Supplementary allowances may also be available to you. The financial assistance that you are eligible for will be calculated by the Coordinator.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE CLAIMANTS

In order to remain eligible for UI while your proposal for the SEA Component is being considered, you must be able to prove that you are still unemployed and available for work. To remain on UI, you must continue to make an effort to find work and you cannot start your business until approval for the SEA Component has been granted in writing. Once the financial assistance is approved, and you have signed a contract, you will be working full time to establish your business, and will receive the greater of your regular UI benefits or a basic allowance.

HOW TO BEGIN

- 1. Attend an Orientation Session. You must contact your local Canada Employment Centre (CEC) to arrange attendance at a business development orientation session provided in your community. During this orientation session you will assess your own abilities in terms of becoming self-employed. Also, the Coordinator will analyze your strengths and needs and recommend whether or not selfemployment is a viable option for you to pursue.
- 2. Identify a business opportunity and prepare a business concept. This may mean coming up with several business ideas for offering products or services that fit your own unique skills, talents and Interests. Then, do some investigating to find out which idea has the best chance of success for attracting and keeping customers.

The following are the kinds of ventures you might consider when looking for ideas. Try offering a product or service:

- not available in the local community;
- that, while locally available, must be imported from elsewhere:
- that a local company uses on a regular basis;
- for which there is a high or increasing demand;
- that would be a more efficient way to produce or lower the cost of an existing product or service;
- using scrap or waste from other businesses to produce a product;
- by inventing, producing and marketing a new product;

- by repackaging an existing product and reselling it; or,
- by repairing or reconditioning a product and reselling it.

There are certain business situations considered not suitable. These include:

- a business controlled by someone offier than the person receiving financial assistance;
- a business where revenue is mainly from commissions, such as salos commissions.

Other conditions include:

- the business must not be a subsidiary of, or financially supported by, another company. People who will be agents for the business or subcontractors cannot get support;
- the business must be suitable for public funding and not exploit sex, religion or polltics:
- you can start your venture in an area of seasonal work but you must work full time on implementing your business plan. You may also be engaged in more that one type of seasonal enterprise;
- if you enter into a partnership, it must reflect that you are in control of the venture and will receive the majority of the profits;
- there may be several Self-Employment Assistance Component participants in a partnership agreement. In this case, participants must receive the majority of the profits; and

- in a limited company, SEA participants must hold the majority of shares with voting rights.
- 3. Complete the Application Form. The application form for the Self-Employment Assistance Component should be filled out prior to attending an orientation session. The form is straightforward and can be added to, or modified, during or following discussions with an EIC official or the Courdinator.
- 4. Prepare a Business Description. A business description is really a short summary of a business idea. It explains:
 - the product(s) or service(s) the business will offer:
 - who will buy what the business has to offer:
 - how it is unique or different from the compelition; and
 - why the business will be successful.

The business description is a necessary part of any business plan. Furthermore, writing a description will give you a clearer picture of your business idea. Before analyzing your business idea, think about existing businesses that may be related to your own. If you can evaluate what makes other businesses work, you should be able to determine how your business can be successful.

- 5. Have your business concept reviewed by the SEA Coordinator in your area. Your application for the SEA Component will be reviewed by the Coordinator. Once your plan has been reviewed, a CEIC official, In conjunction with the Coordinator, will decide whether or not your application will be approved.
- 6. The Agreement. If you are in receipt of UI benefits, you will sign an agreement with the Government of Canada. If you are a Social Assistance recipient, you will sign a letter of understanding with the Coordinator.

7. Prepare a business plan. Help in preparing your business plan is available from the SEA Coordinator in your local community. While the business concept and business description must be completed prior to being approved for the SEA Component, the complete business plan can be completed in further detail with the assistance of the Coordinator. The time taken to complete the business plan is considered as part of the flfty-two (52) weeks for which you are eligible under the SEA Component

COMPLETING YOUR BUSINESS DESCRIPTION

A business description is a written statement of what you want to do and how you plan to do it. Having a good business plan is one of the first steps in running a successful husiness. Make a copy of the plan for yourself, and review this regularly to make sure you are still on track

Most business fallures seem to result from poor planning. Countless pitfalls can be avoided if you spend time now to anticipate how the business will be operated.

Here are some of the questions to be answered in the plan.

1. Management

As manager of the business, you will need to give a brief statement of your background as it relates to the business. Indicate the interests, skills, knowledge, experience and abilities that you possess which will contribute to the business.

If the business is a partnership, give the names of your partners and their background, as well a the role each of you will play in the business.

2. Marketing Plan

Product - Describe your product or service, and why you think customers will buy it. Include any drawings or samples, it appropriate. Will you offer more than one product or service? Are other businesses offering the same or similar products? If so, what makes your product different or unique? What gives you a competitive advantage? Do you have any confirmed customers? (If you have done a market survey, please indicate the results)

Place Where will your product or service be offered and how will you distribute it to your customers? What hours and days will you be available to your customers?

Prices What prices will you charge? Indicate what you will base the prices on and how this will compare with similar products or services. What do you estimate your monthly sales will bo?

Promotion - Who are your customers and how will they find out about your products or survices? Describe your sales strategy. Can you get free publicity for your business? How much do you plan to spend on advertising and how will you advertise? Will you use any other promotional techniques? What follow-up will you do with customers after they have used your products or services? Will you offer guarantees?

3. Production Plan (if applicable)

Briefly describe your plan to manufacture or purchase your products. What kind of physical premises do you need? How will you obtain machinery. fixtures or equipment? Who will he your suppliers? Will you need employees?

4. Financinà

What will be your estimated start-up costs? How do you plan to obtain other funds? Will any of this money have to be repaid if you are not successful? How will you do that?

5. Organization

If your business is organized as something other than a sole proprietorship, provide details on the legal form of the business. and, if appropriate, include an organizational chart outlining the duties of key personnel.

6. Laws and Insurance

- · Will you register your company with the provincial Registrar of Companies? (necessary unless your business is a sole proprietorship operating without a business name).
- · Will your obtain a social service tax number (necessary for certain businesses, such as those selling goods to the public) from the provincial Consumer Tax office?
- · Will you obtain a Revenue Canada Taxation number (necessary for hiring staff?
- · Have you applied for Workers' Compensation for your employees?
- What business licenses and permits do you need?
- What insurance will you obtain for your business? (Contact an insurance agent for details - you may require liability insurance if the public has physical access to your business.) You may also require fire, theft and vehicle insurance.

7. Forecasting

You must include a cashflow in your plan. Show estimates of cash coming into the business as well as disbursements. Include personal investment as well as any outside financing you are planning to obtain, and estimate your expenses over the forecasted period.

8. Accounting and Systems

What accounting systems and records will you use to keep track of the business activities?

9. Assessment of the Business Risk

What risk and critical factors do you feel may affect your business in the first year? Why do you think your business has a good chance of succeeding once the financial assistance has ended?

You should consider these factors when determining whether or not your business concept is a viable one. All of these elements will be examined In further detail with the Coordinator in your local community group.

- Coping with asthma


Through the use of cartoons, program participants are introduced to each of the four themes. Separate sessions for parents and children are conducted by trained program leaders.

City man's on roll with perfect games

Al Brant may have made history when he bowled a perfect game recently at Blue River Lanes in Shelbyville.

But it wasn't much out of the

ordinary for Brant.

Brant, 1722 Tolworth Road, rolled what is believed to be the first 300 game in the history of the annual Shelby County Men's Bowling Association Tournament on March 26. Brant was bowling in the doubles portion of the tournament with partner Dave Starker, the manager of the Shelbyville bowling alley.

Records show that there hasn't been a perfect game rolled during the annual tournament. Starker couldn't remember a perfect game being rolled in the tournament in the 20 years he has bowled in Shelbyville. Brant's perfect game was the 10th known 300 game at Blue River Lanes since it opened in 1959 and is the first in about 18 months, Starker said.

Brant, who recently moved to Shelbyville from Rochester, N.Y., has been bowling for 23 years. The perfect game in the tournament was Brant's fourth. And on several occasions, he has bowled 298s and 299s.

"They're never routine," Brant said. "You're always nervous no matter how many times you do it. Your legs are always like rubber on the last few shots."

Brant may have been nervous, but there weren't many close calls among the 12 strikes.

"Every ball was pretty good," Brant said. "There weren't any crossovers (when the ball goes away from the pocket and to the other side of the headpin) or anything like that. Most of them were solid in the pocket."

"He was throwing good balls and carrying (the ball rolling through the pins and mixing

them up), and when he started to string them together, we figured he'd come close," Starker said.

But the players playing on the same lanes as Starker and Brant didn't tell many of the other bowlers there that night that Brant was about to roll a perfect game.

"Usually when someone's bowling one, a big crowd gets behind them and stands," Starker said. "We didn't want to say anything. We figured he'd be better off without a crowd behind him."

"It was kind of a quiet 300," Brant said.

Remarkably, Brant doesn't bowl very often. He maintains a 202 average bowling just one night a week.
