



BANK OF MONTREAL TAKES NEW APPROACH TO BANKING WITH ABORIGINAL PEOPLES

TORONTO, May 6 /CNW/ -- Bank of Montreal today announced a new approach to provide more effective and responsive banking services to the Aboriginal community in Canada.

Among the initiatives announced today by Bank Vice-Chairman Alan G. McNally are:

the appointment of a Vice-President, Aboriginal Banking. The appointee will be an Aboriginal with extensive business experience.

the establishment of a Steering Committee on the Advancement of Aboriginal Employment. The aim is to raise the level of Aboriginal employment until it is generally proportional to the population served by the Bank.

the formation of a Circle of Aboriginal business leaders and entrepreneurs to guide the Bank and help develop deeper insight and understanding of the financial services needs of the Aboriginal peoples.

a concerted effort to make banking services more accessible to Aboriginal people.

"I believe that the time has come for substantive commitment by Canadian business,'' said Mr. McNally, speaking at the Financial Post/Air Canada conference, 'Doing Business with Aboriginal Canada,' co-sponsored by The Canadian Council for Native Business.

''No quick fix. No cosmetic tokenism. Not what's fashionable today. Rather, a keen awareness of the enormous business potential, and a comprehensive business strategy," he added. "At our Bank, we urgently need to change, and to improve -- to employ more Aboriginals, and to do business with the Native peoples effectively and imaginatively. It's not only the right thing to do, it's the smart thing to do.''

In recognition of the diversity of Canada's Aboriginal peoples, the Bank will seek solutions in the local community -- "A decentralized consultative approach, " said Mr. McNally. "At Bank of Montreal, we call it Community Banking -- local leadership, local decision-making, and tailor-made solutions, community by community across Canada

Bank of Montreal already has dealings with more than 135 Aboriginal groups and organizations in Canada. Mr. McNally told the conference that Bank of Montreal is taking steps to make banking services more accessible to the First Peoples. These steps include putting more branches and Instabanks on or near reserves; ensuring that Community Bankers and Commercial Account Managers have a good understanding of the particular laws and public programs governing the Bank's business with Aboriginals; adapting the Bank's publications to meet the particular needs of Aboriginal customers; and exploring the potential for alliance relationships with Aboriginal financial institutions.

''We are determined to weave our commitment to the Aboriginal peoples into the very fabric of Bank of Montreal culture and our Community Banking approach, " Mr. McNally concluded.



MAY IS SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

The following is an excerpt taken from a memo from the Ontario Women's Directorate:

It is estimated that in Canada, at least one woman in four will be sexually assaulted at some time in her life. Recent research also indicates that the vast majority of women live with the fear of sexual assault.

Fear of sexual violence goes beyond the stereotype of strangers in dark alleys. It extends into our homes, our social lives — even into our intimate relationships. It controls and limits the way we live our lives.

As long as violence against women is tolerated, women will not be truly equal in society. This is why the Ontario government is once again declaring May to be Sexual Assault Prevention Month in Ontario.

Sexual Assault Prevention Month is a province-wide public education campaign aimed at changing the attitudes that allow sexual assault of women to continue. Since 1988, the Ontario Women's Directorate has been coordinating public education activities on this issue.

This year's campaign messages are:

- any sexual act without consent is sexual assault.
- men have a responsibility to ensure they have a woman's consent to sexual activity.
- women have a right, to refuse unwanted sexual contact, no matter what the situation.

WHO NEEDS C.C.S.

When an individual becomes overextended in a complicated credit situation, getting out unassisted sometimes seems almost hopeless.

The result can be extremely hazardous to the debtors' well being, sometimes jeopardising employment, home life and even health and mental stability. Creditors lose confidence in the individual and increase their pressure for payment accordingly.

An impartial public service organization Credit Counselling is devoted to the rehabilitation of the individual. We can help to restore financial stability and enable the unfortunate debtor to recover.

HOW DOES C.C.S. WORK?

Generally the following is an outline of procedures used:

- Step 1. The CLIENT comes to the C.C.S. office by making an appointment. A client is asked to bring in information on income and debts.
- Step 2. The COUNSELLOR interviews the client and obtains full information on the family financial picture. Creditors, amount, payment dates are obtained to the best of the clients' ability to present them.
- Step 3. The COUNSELLOR reviews the facts obtained from the client, analyzes the problem and outlines possible solutions and actions to be taken. The CLIENT decides which course of action he/she wishes to take.
- Step 4. Some clients only require budgeting, some require the help of the counsellor to negotiate a satisfactory solution with their creditors.
- Step 5. In cases requiring a debt repayment program, the creditors are contacted and the situation explained to obtain their co-operation in acceptance of the plan set up. Most creditors want to be helpful and will accept a revision of

payment if recommended by the counsellor as part of a definite composite plan. After agreement, an arrangement is established whereby the client pays an agreed amount to the C.C.S. office.

Step 6. On a suitable disbursement date, C.C.S. makes out and mails cheques to each of the creditors.

Step 7. As time passes, balances are reduced and problems eliminated or adjustments made as new ones arise. Having established the pattern, the client is encouraged to take over management of his.her own affairs and make payments under the advice of the C.C.S. Counsellor.

Step 8. As with any programme COMMUNICATION is the key to success. We encourage the client to talk with the counsellor when any problem arises.
