The Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte in conjunction with Kagita Mikam, are undertaking a demographic and Labour Force Survey. This survey will be administered door to door starting late September reaching every household on the Territory. The information being sought is designed to help us develop or obtain some very directed training programs. In addition, the resulting information will allow us to project our employment needs for the future.

The Council has retained Dan Brant to manage the project and he has secured the services of a data collection firm in Ottawa to compile the results of the survey. No one in the community will have access to the final completed survey forms. With this data base, we will be able to easily access names of individuals when jobs become available. As an incentive to fill in this form and send it back, for every person entered, we will have a lottery type draw on December 10, 1997. The entry drawn at that time will receive a cash prize of \$250.



CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS 11th ANNUAL TRILLIUM BOOK AWARD/PRIX TRILLIUM

TORONTO - The Ministry of Citizenship, Culture and Recreation is inviting submissions for the Government of Ontario's 11th annual literary award. The Trillium Book Award/Prix Trillium recognizes writing excellence in both an English and a French language category, with a \$12,000 prize to each of the winning authors and a \$2,500 prize to their publishers.

This year, publishers have been asked to submit three copies of each title directly to the ministry by November 20th. A book of any genre, except for anthologies and translations, published in 1997 and written in English or French by an Ontario-based writer, may be submitted for consideration.

Submissions should be sent to: Ministry of Citizenship, Culture and Recreation, Cultural Programs Branch, 77 Bloor St. W., 2nd Floor, Toronto, Ontario M7A 2R9.

Two independent juries, one for each category, will review the books. Publishers of the short-listed titles, which will be announced at the end of January, 1998, will be given funds to market and promote each title. The winners will be announced early next spring.

Last year, the English-language prize went to Anne Michaels' Fugitive Pieces, published by McClelland and Stewart. There was a tie in the French-language category, with the prize shared by Le Pied de Sapho by Anne Claire, Éditions TROIS, and Tintin au pays de la Ferveur, Éditions Les Herbes

Previous Trillium Book Award winners have included Michael Ondsatje, Margaret Atwood, Wayson Choy and Alice Munro in the English-language category; Maurice Henrie and Andrée Lacelle in the French category.


Moccasin Trail Walking Program



"THE FLU VACCINE" TO HAVE OR NOT TO HAVE?

Fall is coming and the flu season will soon be among us. The "flu" or "influenza" can be a serious illness for some people.

The flu is caused by a virus which could make a person ill with symptoms of stuffy nose, sore throat, cough, fever, headache and muscle aches. This could lead to complications of pneumonia and death in some people with heart and lung problems. Anyone can get the flu but someone who is over 65 years of age or has a chronic illness such as kidney, heart and lung diseases, cancer, diabetes, a blood disorder or an immune problem should get vaccinated.

The vaccine is free for the above mentioned groups and should be administered during the months of October and November. Yearly vaccinations can prevent the flu in about 80% of people who get the flu shot. The Flu vaccine reduces the severity of the illness and saves lives.

It's time to take action! Call the Thayendanega Health Centre @ 967-3603 if you have any questions or ask your Doctor. If there is enough interest we may have a "flu immunization clinic" at the Thayendanega Health Centre.

PLANNING TO QUIT



Many of our Native people have quit smoking, and many of them did it without any help. They just made up their minds and said, "That's it - no more cigarettes!"

For most people it's a good idea to spend one or two days getting ready to quit.

- 1. Decide on a date when you will quit. The important thing is for you to pick the date - not your doctor, not your family, not your kids. It's your decision.
- 2. Tell your family and friends that you are quitting. Once you have told people you are going to quit, it will be harder for you to change your mind!
- 3. Make your home smoke-free. Don't let anyone smoke in your home. A small sign posted outside can help.
- 4. Get help! Ask someone to quit with you at the same time. Ask a friend or relative who doesn't smoke to support you and to be there when you need someone to talk to.

The Effects on Children Who Witness Family Violence!

- Very young children, even infants, are seriously affected, and may suffer problems with sleeping, weight gain and excessive crying.
- Preschoolers display effects such as anxiety, clingingness and aggressive behaviour.
- Children beyond the infant or preschool age often feel responsible to try to intervene in the abusive situation.
- Teenage children tend to be truant, run away or drop out of school and they tend to become involved in violent dating relationships. They will use denial as a coping method.
- Girls who witness violence have a greater tendency to become withdrawn and depressed, while boys have a greater tendency to act aggressively. These problems can also be present in both boys and girls.
- Boys, especially at age 11 or older, who identify strongly with their fathers may imitate his actions by being aggressive towards women.
- Children from violent homes are being taught that violence is an effective way to gain power and control over others.
- Children are more prone to accept excuses for violent behaviour, and have increased risk of acting aggressively toward peers and adults.
- Greatly increases the chances that a boy will grow up to act violently with dating and/or marital partners. For girls, it increases the chances that she will accept violence which occurs in her dating and/or marital relationships.
- Children who witness violence are being emotionally abused.
- Children frequently experience Post traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). The symptoms of PTSD include re-experiencing the trauma (nightmares, intrusive thoughts or images, flashbacks); fear, anxiety, tension and hyper-vigilance; irritability and outbursts of anger and aggression.
- Children display greatly elevated rates of depression, withdrawal, low selfesteem and other emotional problems.
