REFERENDUM- MINERAL RIGHTS

A referendum vote was held on Saturday, October 2, 1982 at the Mohawk Community Centre asking for the original referendum of 1901 (which gave the Band's mineral rights away) to be reversed. This would re-instate the mineral rights to the Band.

Section 39 (1)(b) of the Indian Act states that a referendum is void unless it is assented to by a majority of the electors of the Band. The results of the first referendum of October 2 asking for the re-instatement of the mineral rights were:

190	-	In favour
2	-	Opposed
1	-	Spoiled Ballot

Although the vote was in favour of this referendum, it was contrary to Section 39 (1)(b) mentioned above and therefore this referendum was defeated.

However, Section 39 (2) of the Indian Act states that if a referendum is held and a majority of the electors of a Band did not vote, another referendum may be called for the same purpose with 30 days notice if the first proposed referendum was assented to by the majority of the electors who did vote.

The Band Council has therefore called for another referendum vote to be held asking for the re-instatement of the mineral rights to the Band for the portion of the Tyendinaga Indian Reserve No. 38 so affected.

This referendum vote is to be held at the Quinte Mohawk School on Saturday, November 13, 1982 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

All eligible voters are asked to cast their ballots as this is an important referendum that could have serious consequences in the near future if not corrected now.

JUSTICE COMMITTEE

Please be advised that Band Council are now accepting applications from persons interested in sitting on a newly formed Justice Committee. There will be five (5) positions available on this Committee. The goals, objectives and terms of reference are listed below. Goals and Objectives

1. Update existing Band By-Laws.
2. Draft new Band By-Laws for presentation to Council.
3. Support Special Constables in their efforts to fulfill a complete community policing program i.e. traffic safety, firearms handling
4. Develop a community correctional service program to deal with juvenile offenders
5. Develop an overall policy for present and future committees to follow with approval and support of Band Council
6. Examine and report on Aboriginal Rights.
7. Develop a communication system with legal services, Ontario Native Councils on Justice, Ontario Police Commissions, Indian Police Commission and Reserve residents.
8. Upon approval and/or direction of Band Council act on other issues pertaining to justice on the Tyendinaga Reserve.

Terms of Reference

1. The Justice Committee operate by the Constitution for Committees on the Tyendinaga Reserve.
2. The Justice Committee study and deal with all areas affecting members of Tyendinaga Reserve:
 - (a) Band By-Laws,
 - (b) Special Constables,
 - (c) Education - safety-firearm control etc.
