Council discussed the cost estimate received from Greer Galloway on February 14, 2023 in the amount of \$14,400. The proposed work includes an assessment regarding the lots on Queen Street, to determine if the location is viable to move 3 of the 5 homes originally approved to be built on the Slash Road (TMC Meeting, June 22, 2022, Motion #20). The 5-home residential development is to be built by October 2023.

Council was advised that the assessment would take 4-6 weeks. Council was also informed that there are concerns at the Queen Street site of the potential presence of karst which may impact the viability of the proposed septic system(s). The funding terms for this project require MBQ to complete site clearing by March 31, 2023, in order to comply with the Migratory Birds Act.

From the Research Department...

Haldimand's Promise and the Simcoe Deed

Sir Frederick Haldimand, Governor of the Province of Quebec, promised in April 1779, during the hostilities of the American Revolution, that the Mohawk communities that had been "ruined" by the American Rebels would be "restored at the expense of Government to the state they were in before" the war. However, when the war ended with the 1783 Treaty of Paris, Britain gave up the Mohawk homelands to the Americans. In recompense for the loss of the homelands and in recognition for their faithful military alliance with the British Crown, the Fort Hunter Mohawks and their allies were to select any of the unsettled lands on the North Shore of Lake Ontario.

Captain John Desertonyon and his followers, about 20 families, arrived on the north shore of the Bay of Kenté (now Quinte) on May 22, 1784. Even before the Landing, while still at Lachine, Captain John had requested a Deed for the land. He knew, without the protection and affirmation of a Deed, the new village would be under threat. The wait for the Deed was 9 more years.

As of April 1, 2023, the Simcoe Deed turns 230 years old.

Please see below a transcribed copy of the Simcoe Deed (Treaty 3 1/2):

The Simcoe Deed (Treaty 3 ½) 1793

Reference: LAC RG10 Volume 1850 IT 006 Indian Affairs (Grants land to the Chiefs, Warriors, Women & People of the Six Nations, specifically land on the Bay of Quinte)

George the Third by the Grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith and so forth. Know ye that Whereas the Attachment and Fidelity of the Chief Warriors and People of the Six Nations to Us and Our Government, have been made manifest on divers occasions by their spirited and zealous exertions and by the bravery of their conduct and We being desirous of shewing Our approbation of the same, and in recompense of the losses they may have sustained, of providing a convenient Tract of Land under Our protection for a safe and comfortable retreat for them and their posterity Have of Our special Grace, certain knowledge and mere motion Given and by these presents Do give and grant unto the Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations and their Heirs for ever all that District or Territory of Land being parcel of a certain District lately purchased by Us of the Mississague Nation lying and being and limitted and bounded

as follows (that is to say) the Tract will then be bounded in front by the Bay of Quinte between the Mouths of the River Shannon and Bowens' Creek about Twelve Miles Westerly by a line running North Sixteen Degrees West from the West side of the Mouth of the River Shannon, and Easterly by a Line running North Sixteen Degrees West from the Mouth of Bowens' Creek, and Northerly by a Line running East Sixteen Degrees North, and West Sixteen Degrees South at the distance of about Thirteen Miles back from the Bay of Quinte, measured on the Western Boundary aforesaid, to the North East Angle of the Township of Thurlow: To Have and to Hold the said District or Territory of Land of Us Our Heirs and Successors to them the Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations and to and for the sole use and behoof of them and their Heirs for ever freely and clearly of and from all and all manner of Rents, Fines or Services whatsoever to be rendered by them the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations to Us or Our Successors for the same And of and from all Conditions Stipulations and Agreements whatever except as hereinafter by Us expressed and declared. Giving and Granting and by these presents confirming to the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations and their Heirs the full and entire possession Use benefit and advantage of the said District or Territory of Land to be held and enjoyed by them in the most free and ample manner and according to the several Customs and usages by them the said Chiefs, Warriors, Women and People of the said Six Nations Provided always and be it understood to be the true intent and meaning of these Presents that for the purpose of assuring the said Lands as aforesaid to the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the Six Nations and their Heirs and of securing to them that free and undisturbed possession and enjoyment of the same. It is Our Royal Will and Pleasure that no Transfer Alienation Conveyance Sale Gift Exchange Lease Property or Possession shall at any time be had made or given of the said District or Territory or any part or parcel thereof by any of the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations to any other Nation or Body of People Person or persons whatsoever other than among themselves the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations but that any such Transfer Alienation Conveyance Sale Gift Exchange Lease or Possession shall be null and void and of no effect whatever. And that no Person or Persons shall possess or occupy the said District or Territory or any part or parcel thereof by or under pretence of any such Alienation or Conveyance as aforesaid or by or under any pretence whatever under pain of Our severe displeasure. And that in case any Person or Persons other than the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations shall under pretence of any such Title as aforesaid presume to possess or occupy the said District or Territory or any part or parcel thereof that it shall and may be lawful of Us our Heirs and Successors at any time hereafter to enter upon the Lands occupied and possessed by any other Person or Persons other than that said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations

and them the said Intruders thereof and therefrom wholly to dispossess and evict and to resume the same to Ourselves Our Heirs and Successors. Provided always nevertheless that if at any time the said Chiefs Warriors Women and People of the said Six Nations should be inclined to dispose of and Surrender their Use and Interest in the said District or Territory, that same shall be purchased only for Us in Our Name at some Public Meeting or Assembly of the Chiefs Warriors and People of the said Six Nations to be held for that purpose by the Governor Lieutenant Governor or Person Administering Our Government in Our Province of Upper Canada. In Testimony whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province to be hereunto affixed. Witness His Excellency John Graves Simcoe Esquire Lieutenant Governor and Colonel Commanding Our Forces in Our said Province. Given at Our Government House at Navy Hall this First Day of April in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand and Seven Hundred and Ninety Three in the Thirty Third Year of Our Reign.

When you call or see a health care service provider, please self-identify as a federally registered First Nations member. You need to make sure you are eligible for provincial or federal benefit coverage for the health program, service, or product you need. You do not want to end up with out-of-pocket expenses for something that was provided to you by one of the NIHB service providers that was never an eligible client benefit. You need to be aware of what your health benefits are.

PLEASE ASK THE SERVICE PROVIDER IF:

- 1. The proposed service/item/treatment is OHIP funded as well as an eligible benefit within the NIHB Program; and
- 2. He/she bills directly to the NIHB Program.

IF YOU HAVE ANY CONCERNS OR QUESTIONS ABOUT YOUR ELIGIBILITY FOR A MEDICAL ITEM, SUPPLY, SERVICE, AND/OR TRAVEL PROVIDED UNDER THE NIHB PROGRAM, PLEASE CALL OR CONTACT ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Your local community health worker who works with the NIHB Program;
- 2. NIHB Client Information Line at 1-800-640-0642; this number is for questions for all benefit areas except dental benefits; and
- 3. For all dental benefit questions, please call the NIHB Dental Client Information Line at 1-855-618-6291.

Important information Indigenous members from Canada need to know before visiting the United States (USA)

Your federally registered status card does not provide you with any type of health care coverage when you travel outside of Canada. If you, or you have friends and family, that are visiting the USA for any reason or any length of time including day trips, you should all understand the following facts before visiting the USA.

1. USA medical costs are very expensive

The USA and Canada have the highest costs for medical care around the globe. A single trip to the emergency room for a few stitches and some antibiotics can cost hundreds of dollars. Foreign visitors without travel health insurance will have to pay out of pocket for their medical treatment. While there are a few welfare hospitals in the USA, most have gone bankrupt and those who remain have very long wait times for non-emergency treatment so you cannot expect to get prompt, top-notch treatment if you do not have travel health insurance.

2. Foreign visitors do not receive free medical care

The USA health care system is not 'free healthcare' – not for visitors or for citizens of the USA This can be the most confusing fact of all for those coming from countries where healthcare is free (or, more accurately, paid for by taxes). Further, foreign visitors on short-term visas as tourists, i.e., not students or temporary foreign workers, do **not** have access to buy their own health insurance from the healthcare marketplaces in the country they are visiting.

3. Emergency Room visits are not free either

Even if your treatment is considered an emergency, the hospital will expect payment for treatment costs, including surgeries, medicines, medical supplies, ambulance transportation, and anything else used to treat you and make you well again. If you are a foreigner and need emergency medical treatment, it's likely that you will be transported to a welfare-based hospital soon after they discover you have no insurance.

4. Students and temporary foreign workers are not exempt

Foreign students and temporary foreign workers are not exempt from the Affordable Care Act requirements to obtain qualified health insurance. If you are a student studying in the USA or a foreign worker, you will have to get health insurance in the USA either through the university or through your employer. If neither, your university or employer can provide you access to health insurance you can buy. You'll need to log in to the government's health care site, choose your state, and start researching a plan you can buy. You should have travel health insurance prior to leaving to cover the trip from your homeland to the USA and ensure coverage is valid for the period of time it takes you to buy and receive health insurance out of country. If you are hospitalized for dehydration due to a flu bug you picked up soon after arrival, for example, and you do not have travel health insurance and your health insurance is not yet in effect, you will be paying for your medical treatment on your own. An overnight stay in the hospital can run into the thousands of dollars (USD); medical treatment for a car accident can bankrupt an individual from which they may never financially recover.

5. An evacuation out of the USA may be necessary

Little known fact: emergency medical evacuations are not usually covered under any USA based health insurance plan. No kidding! If you're a foreign visitor, however, getting an evacuation back to your home country where you can be with family and friends and back in your own health care system is sometimes the only way to control costs if you have an accident in the USA. Nearly all travel health insurance plans have coverage for evacuations back to your home country. The cost of an evacuation depends largely on how far you must travel, so an evacuation from the USA to Canada will cost a lot less than one to Australia but you get the idea. Get coverage for at least \$100,000 -\$300,000 and you should be fine.

6. Pre-existing conditions may cause you trouble

While the Affordable Care Act addresses pre-existing conditions for those living in or citizens of the USA, many travelers are surprised when a travel insurance provider denies their claims due to a pre-existing medical condition. In some cases, the condition is one that the traveler didn't even recognize as a medical condition that could disqualify their coverage. This is especially true of conditions that:

- a doctor diagnosed but did not explain to you
- are controlled by medication you take regularly
- have not yet been diagnosed but symptoms were treated

Travel Insurance is about more than Travel Medical

While having travel medical protection covers the biggest concern that foreign visitors have when going to the USA, travel insurance is not only about travel medical. There are many other travel disasters that can affect your trip in the USA and cause you to incur unexpected costs.

- Trip cancellation and interruption coverage can protect you from big losses if you have to cancel your trip or end it early and return home. There are also different kinds of cancellation coverage to cover specialized instances, including having to cancel for work reasons or cancelling for any reason at all.
- Baggage loss and delay protection means you'll have some not a lot, but some reimbursement for lost or stolen bags no matter where you are on your trip.
- Coverage for missed connections (when you miss a cruise departure, for example) and travel delays (when they cancel all flights due to a hurricane or blizzard, for example).
- Package travel insurance plans combine lots of benefits into a full-featured plan that gives a foreign visitor to the USA a lot of protection. See a local travel agent/guide for more details on coverage options you can choose for your visit to the United States.
- Travel insurance can be purchased in a variety of ways at your personal financial institution, local travel agencies and on-line just to name a few options. If you are a valid credit card holder, you may want to check with your card provider as many credit cards may already cover you for different types of travel. If they do, make sure that you understand the specific policy criteria, length of time and conditions as it may differ depending on where and when you travel and your travel reason.
