





WHEREAS, it is the special mission of FNTI to design, develop and otherwise provide all manner of post-secondary education, training and lifelong learning opportunities, including applied knowledge and research, for Indigenous people which strengthens Indigenous identities, languages, and intellectual traditions, and meets the education, economic, social and cultural needs of Indigenous communities and nations

WHEREAS, FNTI may carry out any and all ancillary functions which are common to a post-secondary institution and has received accreditation via the Indigenous Institutes Act of 2017

WHEREAS, Article 13 of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, adopted by the UN General Assembly on September 13, 2007, affirms that "Indigenous peoples have the right to revitalize, use, develop and transmit to future generations their histories, languages, oral traditions, philosophies, writing systems and literatures, and to designate and retain their own names for communities, places and persons, "and further declares that "States shall take effective measures to ensure that this right is protected"

WHEREAS, FNTI initiatives are carried out in the Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory, throughout Canada, and elsewhere

THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, The Tyendinaga Mohawk Council endorses, approves and authorizes FNTI to erect a new campus building on the Mohawk Aerodrome property in order to fully support FNTI's capacity to increase their provision of post-secondary education to Indigenous peoples. M.C.R. #2022/23-059.

A Path Forward (APF) is a permanent and evolving multi-disciplinary physical and virtual art exhibit developed in partnership between Tsi Tyónnheht Onkwawén:na Language and Cultural Centre (TTO), the Gord Downie & Chanie Wenjack Fund (DWF), and The County Museums (TCM).

In June 2021, the Picton Main Street statue of John A. Macdonald was vandalized after the discovery of unmarked graves on the grounds of the former Kamloops Residential School. The intent of this partnership and exhibit is to contribute to the unfolding story of Truth & Reconciliation efforts in Prince Edward County.

APF will be housed at Macaulay Heritage Park in Picton. (*Artists wishing to only temporarily loan work to TTO for APF may also be considered and fair compensation for this arrangement will be determined on a case-by-case basis.)*

TTO invites Indigenous artists/creators to consider new or existing work, in any medium including but not limited to: painting, sculpture, performance, multimedia, etc. The exact number of pieces will be determined in the near future based on the interest of Indigenous artists and creators and the total space required for their pieces. The *APF* partners intend to update the exhibit and programming schedule regularly, incorporating fresh work and perspectives.

For the creation, presentation and purchase of art, and the sharing of Indigenous perspectives and stories, artists' compensation will be evaluated by TTO and will be based on each artist's works and project needs. 

From the Research Department:

The Barnhart Brothers Come to the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte

From MBQ records we see that George and David Barnhart were brothers, their place of birth is currently unknown. The came to the Mohawk Tract in the 1820's. Before this, George spent time in the Kahnawake area and David's marriage record indicates that he was from the Cornwall area. Both brothers were "involved" with the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte.

George said he and Deborah Hill, (daughter of Joseph Hill Sr. and Sarah Wedine) were married in 1827, but were they married? According to Saltern Givins, Missionary to the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte, they were not married. They had four children and soon after the birth of her last child, Deborah died in 1834. George, then became a problem in the community.

George had left a family, a wife and three children, in Kahnawake when he came to the Mohawk Tract. Saltern Givins wrote in 1844: "Presuming upon the right of the children to share the privilege of Mohawks, he took possession of a lot of land on this tract which had been allotted to another family under the sanction of Mr. Superintendent Clench & has kept it ever since. There exists a strong feeling in the tribe against him, inconsequence of his abusive & quarrelsome disposition which has led to the exclusion of his family..."

T. G. Anderson, Visiting Superintendent of Indian Affairs, reported in 1846 that the Chiefs insist that Barnhart is a very bad character and wish him to be removed from the tract; that he being a white man should have taken the woman he married with him and not have taken possession of theirs (the Indian Lands); that Barnhart took his wife away with him when he married and returned to the Tract after the death of his wife in 1834 bringing with him the three children; that Barnhart, formerly married to an Indian woman in Lower Canada, who is now living in Kahnawake.

Over the years George committed or allegedly committed numerous crimes including trespassing on the Mohawk Tract, shooting his brother, shooting at others, and killing Joseph Dafoe in 1854. The Mohawk Council of the day were sympathetic towards and supportive of the children.

The children of George and Deborah Barnhart were: Charlotte, Mary Anne, George and Deborah. Mary Ann was the only child to remain in the Mohawk tract.

Mary Ann first married David D. Claus and had four children: Deborah, (who married Peter Joe Brant), Julianna, (who died young), Mary Ann, (who married William B. William), Sarah (who also died young). Secondly, Mary Ann married Peter Moses. They had four children: Charlotte, (who married Cornelius Maracle Jr.), Anna (who married R.J. Barnhart), John P., Katherine (who married Wellington Jaynes). Thirdly, she married Isaac Penn, they did not have any children. Are you a descendant of Mary Ann Barnhart?







2023 Grow-out Plan

A message from KSSLC Head Gardener

Shekon!

"We plan to grow out most of the lettuces in the collection this year for seed, because we are caught up on most of the other crop types. Lettuces are self-pollinating and can be grown quite close together, so it will be a lettuce party in the gardens! We are going to start the Red Wethersfield onions under lights next week, along with Giant Carentan leeks. For our Seed to Salsa event in August, we will be featuring the Cayenne Long Red hot pepper, and the Roma Yellow Belle sweet pepper. We will be starting tomatoes under lights in early April-feel free to send us your preferences! Other highlights will be Buffalo Creek squash (from a local collection, not from the Heirloom Seed Sanctuary collection), many types of bean, and of course, an important corn-still to be decided on."


