Interesting Families of Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory

In the 19th century, the family of David & Hannah (Hill) Barnhart, was one of the most colourful and perhaps most talked about families in the community.

Hannah Hill, the daughter of Joseph Hill Senior and Sarah Wedine, was born about 1811 and died March 4, 1901. Her husband, David Barnhart, from the Cornwall area, was born about 1801 and died sometime after the 1871 census. David and Hannah were married at St. Thomas' Church in Belleville on December 24, 1826. They had a large family and they lived near Christ Church.

In 1861, Missionary G. A. Anderson reported that this family was annoying the community and the Councillors wanted them moved to the back of the Territory. Anderson said, "on Sundays numbers of whites collect at their house and keep up a constant row and sometimes dance all night". [LAC RG 10 Volume 414 pp. 364-368 Reel C-9618]

In May 1867, some men of the community signed a petition against this family. They stated: "The Barnhart family live near the Church and keep a shameful house, everyday but more particularly on Sundays". They reported drinking and they wanted some of the family to be removed from membership for bad behaviour. [LAC RG10 Vol. 310. p. 208803]

It was also reported that this house was frequented by men of the community. [LAC RG10 Volume 551 pp. 193-194 Reel C-13360]

In the summer of 1867, the community had had enough and took direct action in the form of "pulling" the house down on two occasions. But with the help of friends, it was rebuilt twice. [LAC RG10 Volume 551 pp. 193-194 Reel C-13360]

Missionary Anderson reported there were rumours that further "mischief was threatened" and he advised the community "not to take the law into their own hands but all was of no avail". [LAC RG10 Volume 414 pp. 812-814 Reel C-9618]

The partying at the house continued until finally the house was torched and it burned to the ground. No one was hurt. [LAC RG 0 Volume 414 pp. 812-814 Reel C-9618]

The Visiting Superintendent of Indian Affairs, W.R. Bartlett, investigated the fire but he could not find out who had set fire to the house. It was suspected that the fire was started by the wives of men who had visited this “house of ill fame”. [LAC RG10 Volume 311 pp. 210111-210113 C-12683]

Bartlett reported community members were fully aware that the “act of burning down the house...was a serious breach of the law”. But the community was very relieved when the Barnhart family relocated.

The daughters of Hannah and David all eventually married men from off the Territory. The boys of the family remained on the Membership list, and they are the origin of the Barnhart name for the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte.
