
In Flanders Fields

From the Research Department...

In the fall of 2022, nine Last Post markers were placed in three of Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory cemeteries and one in a cemetery in Yellowknife, NWT. The markers were placed to honour nine men who served in World War One who did not have a permanent grave marker.

The information below was gathered from various sources including: church records, death records & World War One personnel files, etc.

For more information on these nine veterans please see the Book of Remembrance at the MBQ Administration Office foyer or at the Kanhiote Library.

In All Saints' Cemetery:

William Brant served as William Sero

Regimental #636494

b. 25th July 1897 is what his attestation paper says. In fact he was born on 16th July 1901 [WW1 File]

d. 24th May 1965 [OBIT] buried May 1965

Parents: Maggie Brant & Allen Sero

He signed up on the 8th February 1916 in Deseronto, Ontario. While serving, it was discovered that he lied about his age. He had signed up at the age of 15 but he continued to serve. In December 1916, he was sent into the field, and he was wounded in 1916 & 1917. In December 1918 he was sent back to Canada. He was discharged on the 20th of January 1919 in Kingston, Ontario.



BURTON "Paddy" BRANT

Regimental #166477

b. 26th November 1891 [Attestation Paper] Sudbury, Ontario

d. 8th June 1960 [in Kingston; LAC Death Card] buried 11th June 1960

Parents: David S. & Eliza E. (Brant) Brant He signed up on 13th October 1915 in Sudbury Ontario. He arrived in England in December 1915.

In 1916 while serving in France he was "Kicked in the face by a mule, breaking his nose." He made a full recovery. In January 1918 he was granted the "Good Conduct Badge". He was discharged in 1919.



In Christ Church Cemetery:

Anthony Maracle

Regimental #928669

b. October 1883, according to his baptismal record. His attestation paper says he was born 15th January 1886.

d. 28th April 1919 from tuberculosis [Death Registration] buried 29th April 1919 [Church Record] Parents: Moses & Jenny (Williams) Maracle He signed up on the 1st of March 1916 in Mount Forest, Ontario

On the 16th of May 1916 in Guelph, Ontario, Anthony was discharged from the military for being "medically unfit" for service. His conduct and character while in the service was described as "Good".



Alfred A Brant

Regimental #219956

b. 14th July 1879 according to his baptismal record. His attestation paper says he was born 11th July 1879.

d. 21st November 1959 [LAC Veterans' Death Cards First World War RG150 Accession 1992/3 Mikan No. 46114 p.1180] buried 24th November 1959 [OBIT]

Parents: Peter Joe & Debby (Claus) Brant He arrived in England in May 1916, then sent to France (Havre) on the 13th August 1916. He suffered multiple injuries during his time in the war.

He was discharged 13th December 1918, he returned to Canada on the 16th January 1918.



Burget Brant

Official Number 298049 Rank: Stoker for the Royal Navy

b. 16th February 1880, according to his baptismal record. His death registration reported that he was born on 11th February 1880

d. 28th June 1925 from myocarditis, inflammation of the heart; buried 30th June 1925 [Church Record]

Parents: Jacob & Margaret (Green) Brant According to his Royal Navy file from the National Archives, England, Burget served on many different vessels during the war, from 25th December 1914 to 26th April 1919. His job as stoker was important as he was part of the team that tended the furnace on board ships. He was discharged in June 1919.

He served in military engagements at sea.




Charles Clinton Brant

Regimental #220324

b. 11th April 1901, according to his baptismal record. His attestation paper stated he was born on the 11th April 1897.

d. 23rd May 1942 struck and killed by a car [Death Registration] buried 25th May 1942 Parents: Edward & Annie (Brant) Brant He signed up on the 29th December 1915, in Belleville, Ontario. He left Canada on the 16th May 1916 and arrived in England on the 30th May 1916.

In September 1916 he was found to be underage, but he continued to serve. He returned to England in January 1919. He was discharged on the 20th March 1919 in Kingston.



Joseph Corby



Facts Indigenous Visitors Need to Know Before Visiting the USA or travelling outside of Canada

If you have friends and family travelling outside of Canada for any reason or any length of time, you should understand the following facts before visiting the United States of America (USA).

1. Medical Costs are Very Expensive

The USA and Canada have the highest costs for medical care around the globe. A single trip to the emergency room for a few stitches and some antibiotics can cost hundreds of dollars. Foreign visitors without travel health insurance will have to pay out of pocket for their medical treatment. While there are a few welfare hospitals worldwide, most have gone bankrupt and those who remain have very long wait times for non-emergency treatment so you cannot expect to get prompt, top-notch treatment if you do not have travel health insurance.

2. Foreign Visitors do not Receive Free Medical Care

The global health care system is not 'free healthcare' – not for visitors of a foreign country. This can be the most confusing fact of all for those coming from countries where healthcare is free (or, more accurately, paid for by taxes). Further, foreign visitors on short-term visas as tourists, i.e., not students or temporary foreign workers, do not have access to buy their own health insurance from the healthcare marketplaces in the country they are visiting.

3. Emergency Room Visits are Not Free Either

Even if your treatment is considered an emergency, the hospital will expect payment for treatment costs, including surgeries, medicines, medical supplies, ambulance transportation, and anything else used to treat you and make you well again. If you are a foreigner and need emergency medical treatment, it's likely that you will be transported to a welfare-based hospital soon after they discover you have no insurance.

4. Students and Temporary Foreign Workers are not exempt

Foreign students and temporary foreign workers are not exempt from the Affordable Care Act requirements to obtain qualified health insurance. If you are a student studying abroad or a foreign worker, you will have to get health insurance in the host country either through the university or through your employer. If neither, your university or employer can provide you access to health insurance you can buy. You'll need to log in to the country's health care site, choose your location, and start researching a plan you can buy. You should have travel health insurance prior to leaving to cover the trip from your homeland to foreign destination and ensure coverage is valid for the period of time it takes you to buy and receive health insurance out of country. If you are hospitalized for dehydration due to a flu bug you picked up soon after arrival, for example, and you do not have travel health insurance and your health insurance is not yet in effect, you will be paying for your medical treatment on your own. An overnight stay in the hospital can run into the thousands of dollars (USD); medical treatment for a car accident can bankrupt an individual from which they may never financially recover.

5. An Evacuation Out of May Be Necessary

Little known fact: emergency medical evacuations are not usually covered under any USA based health insurance plan. No kidding! If you're a foreign visitor, however, getting an evacuation back to your home country where you can be with family and friends and back in your own health care system is sometimes the only way to control costs if you have an accident in the host country. Most travel health insurance plans have coverage for evacuations back to your home country. The cost of an evacuation depends largely on how far you have to travel, so an evacuation from the USA to Canada will cost a lot less than one to Australia but you get the idea. Get coverage for at least \$100,000 -\$300,000 and you should be fine.

6. Pre-existing Conditions May Cause You Trouble

While the Affordable Care Act addresses pre-existing conditions for those living in or citizens of the USA, this is not true for other foreign countries, many travelers are surprised when a travel insurance provider denies their claims due to a pre-existing medical condition. In some cases, the condition is one that the traveler didn't even recognize as a medical condition that could disqualify their coverage. This is especially true of conditions that:


- ·a doctor diagnosed but did not explain to you
- ·are controlled by medication you take regularly
- ·have not yet been diagnosed but symptoms were treated

Travel Insurance is about more than Travel Medical

While having travel medical protection covers the biggest concern that foreign visitors have when going outside of Canada, travel insurance is about travel medical. There are many other travel disasters that can affect your trip outside of Canada and cause you to incur unexpected costs.

- Trip cancellation and interruption coverage can protect you from big losses if you have to cancel your trip or end it early and return home. There are also different kinds of cancellation coverage to cover specialized instances, including having to cancel for work reasons or cancelling for any reason at all.
- Baggage loss and delay protection means you'll have some not a lot, but some reimbursement for lost or stolen bags no matter where you are on your trip.
- Coverage for missed connections (when you miss a cruise departure, for example) and travel delays (when they cancel all flights due to a hurricane or blizzard, for example).
- Package travel insurance plans combine lots of benefits into a full-featured plan that gives a foreign visitor to a foreign location a lot of protection. See a local travel agent/guide for more details on coverage options you can choose for your visit to your selected travel destination.
- Travel insurance can be purchased in a variety of ways at your personal financial institution, local travel agencies and on-line just to name a few options. If you are a valid credit card holder, you may want to check with your card provider as many credit cards may already cover you for different types of travel. If they do, make sure that you understand the specific policy criteria, length of time and conditions as it may differ depending on where and when you travel and your travel reason.

Respiratory Illness **FACTS**

WHAT ARE RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES?

In Ontario, during the fall and winter there is more spread of respiratory viruses like influenza and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and continued spread of COVID-19

- Respiratory viruses affect the airways and
- Respiratory viruses spread easily from person to person
- Most people have mild symptoms that get better in a few days but some people get very sick

Treatment

- Antiviral treatment for COVID-19 and influenza is recommended for those at high risk of severe illness (elders, babies, young children, pregnant people, immunocompromised people, etc.)
- Babies and young children with serious lung or heart disease or who were born premature may be eligible for preventative RSV treatment

PROTECT YOURSELF, YOUR FAMILY & COMMUNITY

- Watch for signs of illness and stay home if you
- Wear a well-fitted medical mask or KN95 in crowded indoor settings
- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand rub
- · Keep high touch surfaces clean (door handles, light switches, phones, etc.)
- Avoid visiting to those who are sick
- Make sure you and your family are up to date with immunizations

Immunization

- Immunization is your best protection against respiratory illnesses
- All Ontarians, over 6 months of age should get their flu shot and COVID-19 booster
- RSV vaccine may available to those living in long-term care, elder care lodges, and retirement homes later in the respiratory illness season

The time has come for the Federal Government to bring about the necessary change to fix these issues for you and every Indigenous person in Canada.

Please consider taking the few minutes required to sign Parliamentary Petition e-4564 to help try and bring about the necessary changes.

The petition is asking for the Federal Government to authorize changes in the following 3 ways:

- 1) Update T4RIF tax slips to show income as tax-exempt
- 2) Register tax-exempt Canada Pension Plan (CPP) contributions as exempt when contributed
- 3) Update T4A (P) tax slips for CPP retirement benefits to illustrate tax-exempt payments

These changes, if made, will at least reduce if not eliminate, the number of reassessments being completed each year on Indigenous individuals. For some households they may also increase the amount of other benefits received.

The time has come for a change, help us by voicing your support through signing Parliamentary Petition e-4564! There is no minimum age for signing, any Canadian can sign!



Instructions for Signing Parliamentary Petition e-4564

The petition is asking for the Federal Government to fix the following issues for Indigenous individuals with tax-exempt pension income in retirement:

- 1) Update T4RIF slips to avoid individuals having their tax returns reassessed, which often results in tax payable, Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and other benefits and tax credits clawed-back
- 2) Have Canada Pension Plan (CPP) contributions on tax-exempt income registered as taxexempt as contributions are submitted for Indigenous individuals
- 3) Update the T4A (P) for CPP retirement benefits to clarify tax-exempt CPP income to avoid taxation of tax-exempt funds

Because these issues have not yet been addressed and fixed, retired Indigenous individuals are constantly having their tax returns reassessed, being asked for taxes that are not owed, and having much-needed benefits clawed-backed.



the Basics:

- Head lice are parasitic insects that live solely on the scalp hair of human beings, usually on children 10 and under.
- Like all insects, head lice develop in stages from egg (nit) to nymph (smaller version of an adult) to louse (fully grown).
- Head lice can reproduce rapidly and should be treated immediately with special treatment products that can be purchased at your local drugstore.

Prevention:

- Do not to share combs, brushes, hats, scarves, hair ties or bands.
- Avoid head-to-head contact.
- Treat Head Lice quickly and effectively.

the Facts:

- Anyone can get head lice. People who have head lice are not dirty.
- If your head itches, it's possible that you have head lice. Be sure to go to your parents or school nurse so they can check it out.
- Head lice cannot jump or fly. They can only crawl onto your head if your head touches the head of a person who already has head lice.
- Head lice cannot live on a desk, chair back, or cubby.
- People can get rid of head lice with special combs and treatment gels that can easily be purchased at a drugstore.







High Risk Babies

- -Infants premature at birth and under 6 months of age
- -Children born with heart defects and lung disease
- -Children with compromised immune systems.
- -Children with neuromuscular

disorders

Signs and Symptoms

- -Runny nose, fever, cough.
- -Short periods without breathing, trouble eating, drinking, or swallowing.
- -Wheezing, flaring of the nostrils or straining at the chest or stomach when breathing.
- -Breathing faster than normal or trouble breathing.
- -Turning blue at the lips or fingertips.

Prevention -RSV antibody vaccination

for infants below 8 months old.

- -Also for 8 months to 18 months for children with chronic lung disease, and severely immunocompromised children.
- -Wash your hands routinely with warm water and soap for at least 20n seconds.
