From the Research Department...

"Sero" and "Moses" names at the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte

Is the Sero name and Moses name connected? Are they the same family? The Research Department has uncovered documents that may tell us may help us answers these questions.

According to records we have so far, "Sero" appears to be the earlier name. It is found in a St. George's, Kingston, Church Record from 1818. The name is also found in the St. Thomas', Belleville, Church Records spelled "Serault" in 1830. It may have a French origin from the time the Fort Hunter Mohawks spent at Lachine. "Moses" is not a MBQ surname in the St. George's, Kingston Church Records, or the early St. Thomas' at Belleville Church Records.

In 1833, the Missionary Saltern Givins recorded the baptismal of "Margaret Moses" child of Jacob & Margaret Moses. This might be the first use of "Moses" as a surname for MBQ. In 1836, Missionary Givins stated that James & Christeen "Sero or Moses" had a daughter Mary. In the 1830s the Mohawk Church recorded the "Sero" name, also sometimes spelled "Serolt". It looks like there were some "Sero" families that could be "Sero" or "Moses" and there were other "Sero" families that stayed just "Sero".

The 1834 annuity payment list shows a Moses Sero with family, John Sero with family and Esther Sero (who might have been John's sister). There is a Jacob Moses with family. But in other documents this Jacob "Moses" is known as Jacob "Serault". In the 1860 census done by Indian Affairs, there are both "Moses" families and "Sero" families. The "Moses" names listed are: James Moses Sr., James Moses Jr., Peter Moses, Jacob Moses Sr., and Jacob Moses Jr. The "Sero" names listed are: Dennis Sero, Jacob Sero, Abram Sero, Margaret Sero and Moses Sero. Most seem to be connected to Dennis Sero Senior who was the father of John Sero (who went to Six Nations), Esther Sero (who married at Six Nations), and Abram Sero, who stayed at the Bay of Quinte.

In the 1871 census done by Indian Affairs there are still "Moses" families and "Sero" families. However, there are instances when someone was known officially as "Moses" but in their own lives they used the surname Sero. For example, although officially listed as "Nelson Moses", Nelson also used the name "Nelson Sero". We have not found a document which explains why some people known as "Sero" became known as "Moses" especially in official lists. It might have to do with the Missionary Saltern Givins as (so far as we know now) he is the first to record "Moses" as an alternate surname to "Sero".

The alternative spelling, "Scero" appears to be a 20th century modification. Several families known officially as "Sero" used the spelling "Scero" in birth, marriage & death records, and in census reports. According to a report by Kungol Nate in 2006, the name "Sero" is connected to the surname Deer. The French word for deer is "cerf". Even today in 2024, there are still "Sero" families and "Moses" families.
