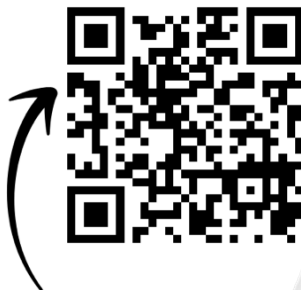

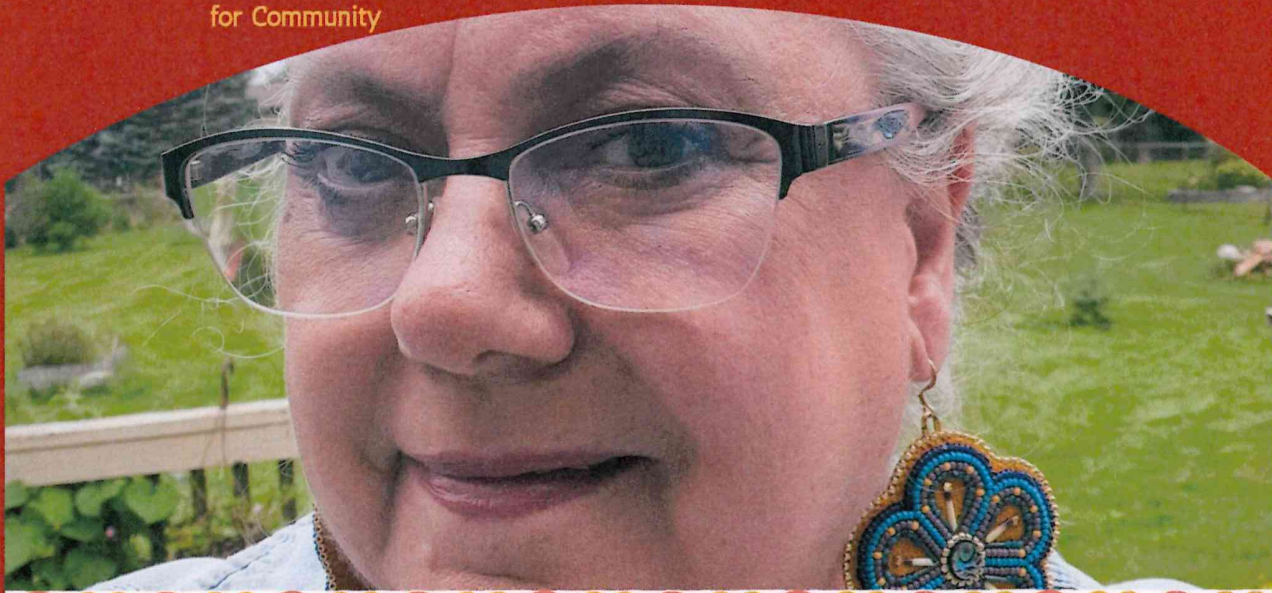

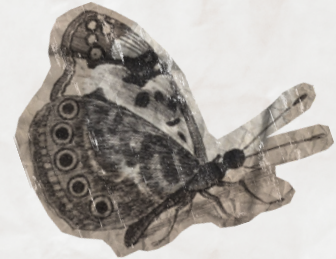

As Primary Healthcare Providers, Onkwehón:we Midwives provide culturally appropriate maternal and newborn care by harmonizing traditional and contemporary knowledge systems. Kenhtè:ke Midwives also provides apprenticeship training for future Onkwehón:we Midwives. We aim to provide care that sustains our way of life by birthing our children in the hands of our own people, on our land, using our language, traditions, culture and traditional medicines whenever possible.

As we enter into a cycle of organizational renewal and strengthening our circle, Kenhtè:ke Midwives is seeking new leaders to join our Board of Directors, beginning in fall/winter 2025 for a 3-year term. Board Directors play a central role in advancing Kenhtè:ke Midwives’ mission and strengthening the organization’s ability to serve Indigenous birthing families in and around our territory. Directors will provide thoughtful leadership in areas such as organizational direction, policy, strategic planning, and fiduciary accountability. The Board also supervises the Executive Administrative Director and provides overall organizational leadership as required. Board Directors can expect to dedicate approximately 10-15 voluntary hours per month, including board meetings and committees’ work and participation.

Through this experience, successful candidates can expect to gain and practice community-shaping governance and leadership skills; work collaboratively with like-minded volunteers; increase their understanding of non-profit organizational financial literacy and stewardship; build relationships with community service providers and reproductive health care sector Indigenous champions and leaders; and grow opportunities to influence strategic directions for the organization through their informed knowledge and perspectives.

At their core, Board Directors are individuals who are deeply committed to Kenhtè:ke Midwives’ dedication to providing culturally appropriate midwifery care and care for birthing families and the pursuit of autonomy and self-determination in health care services available to our communities. Board Director candidates must be independent of the Ministry of Health, and/or any organization with an identical mandate, and must not be arm's length with any current Director of the Board or the Executive Administrative Director.

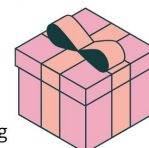

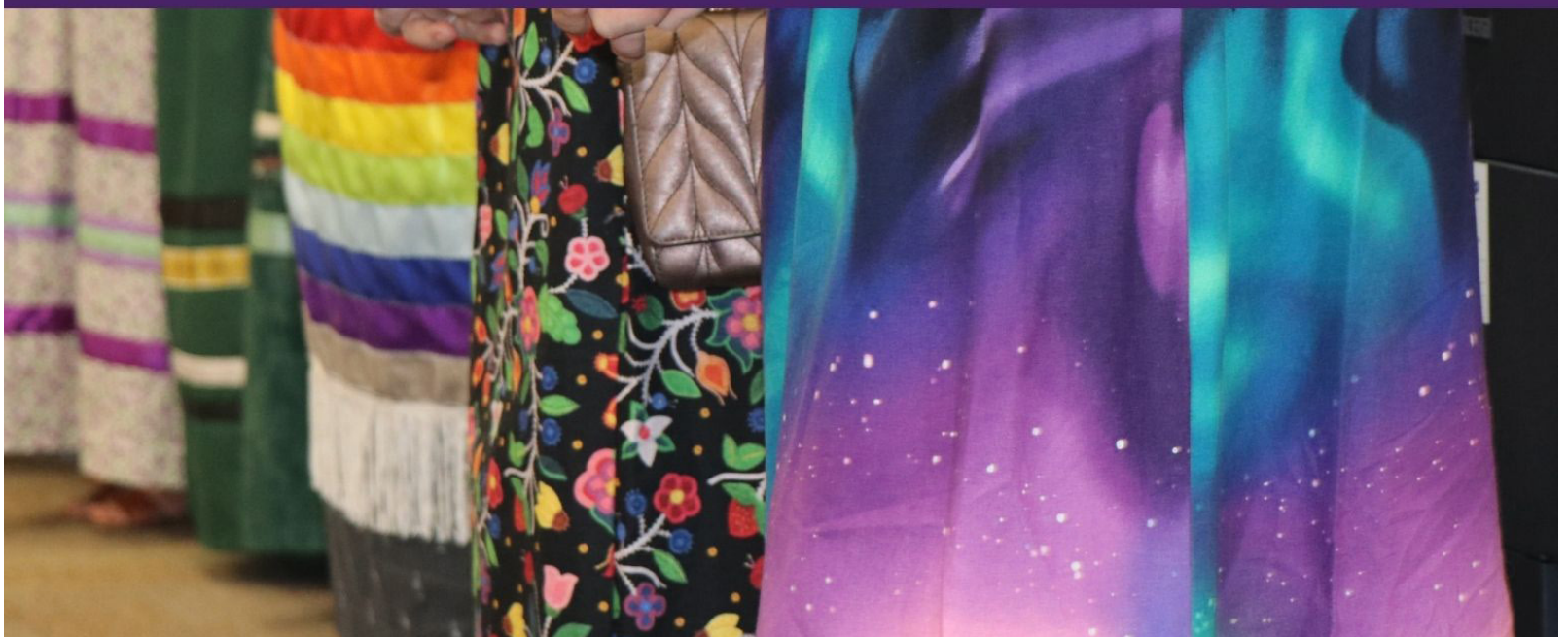

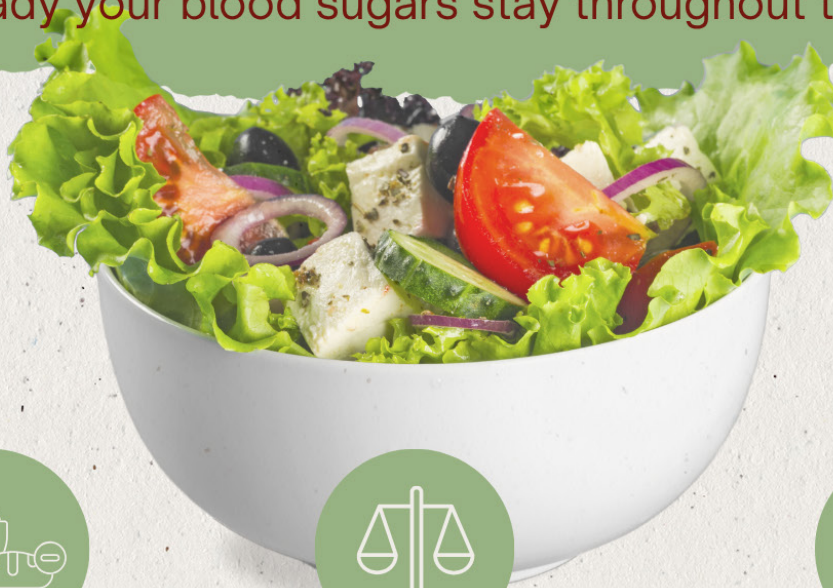

Nutrition & Diabetes

The Basics

Managing blood sugar starts with food choices. What you eat can affect how your body uses insulin and how steady your blood sugars stay throughout the day.



Carbohydrates:
Foods like bread, rice, fruit, milk, & sweets raise blood sugar. The type & amount matter.



Balanced meals: Aim for a mix of carbs, protein, and healthy fats.



High-fiber foods:
Whole grains, beans, vegetables, and fruit help slow blood sugar rises.

PORTION SIZES MATTER

Even healthy foods can raise blood sugar if eaten in large amounts.

HYDRATION Choose water most often. Sweetened drinks (pop, juice, specialty coffees) can spike blood sugar quickly.

Putting it into practice

Small changes can make a BIG difference.

Build a Healthy Plate

½ plate: non-starchy vegetables (broccoli, salad, peppers)

¼ plate: lean protein (beans, lentils, fish, chicken, tofu)

¼ plate: whole grain or starchy food (brown rice, sweet potato, whole wheat bread)

Carb Smart Tips

Spread carbs throughout the day instead of eating a lot at once.

Pair carbs with protein or healthy fats for steadier blood sugars.

Read labels—aim for more fiber and less added sugar.

Lifestyle Factors

Be active most days (walking, biking, yoga).


Aim for regular meals and snacks to prevent blood sugar highs and lows.

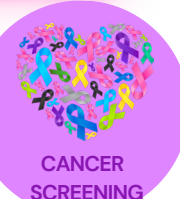

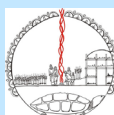

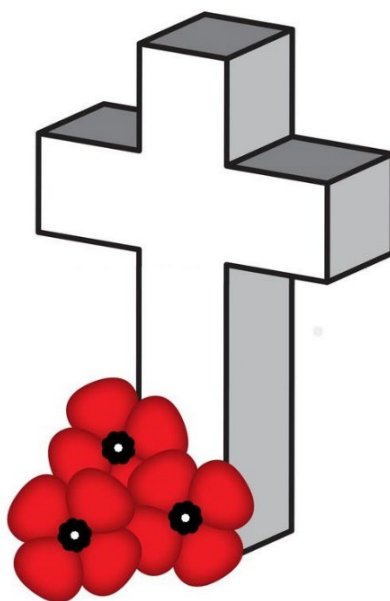
In Flanders Fields

EMERGENCY HOME REPAIR INCENTIVE

This program will provide up to \$20,000 to address emergency repairs and health and safety issues for community members with a low household income who are homeowners and reside on-territory. The funding will support repairs to address permanent residences that lack basic facilities or need emergency repairs to keep the occupants safe.

ELIGIBILITY

- Must own the home.
- Must be a member of the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte.
- Must reside on Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory.
- Must complete an application.



ELIGIBLE REPAIRS

- Repair or replace a broken heating system. Ventilation and AC will only be considered for the promissory note component of this program.
- Repair structural damage to your foundation, roof or exterior walls.
- Repair or replace windows and exterior doors.
- Repair plumbing problems to address health and safety hazards, including hot water tanks and failing septic systems.
- Repair wiring and electrical systems to address health and safety hazards and to meet code.
- Mold remediation and abatement.
- Replace or repairs of leaky or damaged roof.
- Accessibility ramps and interior modifications.

Are You Transferring Land? Here's What You Need to Know!

The Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte (MBQ) has a clear process for the transfer of land between members.

Step-by-Step Land Transfer Process

- ✔ Both the Transferor (current landholder) and Transferee (recipient) must be registered MBQ members.
 - ✔ Confirm that the land is located on Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory and is eligible for transfer. Contact the MBQ Lands Office for assistance with legal land descriptions and to confirm lot information.
 - ✔ Fill out and submit an MBQ Internal Request for Land Transfer form to the Lands Office. This form can be downloaded from the MBQ website, a copy is also shown on back of this flyer. Once the form has been verified, the Transferor (current landholder) will be contacted to set up an appointment to come in and sign the Land Transfer Documents.
- ▶ The transfer is signed in the presence of Lands Officer/Commissioner of Oaths,
 - ▶ The transfer is sent to the next Regular Business Meeting for Council Approval,
 - ▶ The transfer is registered in the Indian Lands Registry System and an Application is sent to Indigenous Services Canada.
- ✔ **A Certificate of Possession is issued.**

Important Reminders

- No land transfer is official without Council approval.
- Transferring land to non-MBQ members is NOT permitted.
- Land transfers through **Wills** or **Estates** follow additional requirements, contact the Lands Office for more information on the Estate Land Transfer Process.

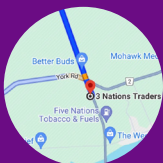
