Essential Qualifications

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent (Grade 12 from any Canadian province)
- Valid driver's licence in good standing
- 19 years of age or older
- No criminal record for which a pardon has not been granted
- Good moral character and habits
- Strong oral and written communication skills
- Self-disciplined, motivated, and community-oriented
- Must meet health, psychological, vision, hearing, and physical standards
- Current First Aid/CPR certification

Desirable Qualifications

- Knowledge and understanding of Haudenosaunee culture
- Currently employed as a police officer in Canada and in good standing
- Post-secondary education - degree or diploma
- Experience working with youth to promote healthy lifestyle choices

- Subject to a police background, security investigation and psychological testing.
